Christ is Risen!

This year Ukraine celebrates the Resurrection of Christ in conditions of suffering. Christ's resurrection reminds us that our suffering is temporary. "Do not weep, Mary is My Mother," said the Lord to the Blessed Virgin, "for soon you will truly rejoice." So we can say: "Don't cry, Ukraine, because you will soon win and rejoice." After the Resurrection of Christ, death ceased to be terrible. Therefore, we see that Christians are not afraid of death. Before our eyes, Ukrainians give their lives for the freedom of Ukraine and are not afraid of death. This is proof that Christ overcame death not only in His human nature, but in each of us. Today we celebrate the death of death and the beginning of a new life. Look at our warriors: they are not afraid of death. Why aren't they afraid of death? Because our Lord Jesus Christ overcame death. The absence of fear of death is proof that it has been defeated. The victory of Jesus Christ over death is in general the victory of good over evil. When we see that evil triumphs, we must be sure that it is a temporary victory for evil. The resurrection of Christ became the guarantee of eternal life of mankind. In times of sorrow and grief, as we experience the death of our loved ones, the Resurrection of Christ inspires great hope in our hearts. It gives us the strength to overcome sorrow and grief. The resurrection of Christ unites the living and the dead. Not only do we pray for the dead, but we believe that the time will come when we will meet again in eternal life. Christ's resurrection motivates us to fight against sin...The resurrection of Christ is such an important event that the Holy Apostle Paul defines it as the truth of all Christian teaching: "If Christ has not been raised," he says, "then our preaching is in vain, and your faith is in vain" (1 Cor. 15:14). He teaches that you must believe in the Resurrection of Christ in order to be saved: "If you believe in your heart that God raised Jesus Christ from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10: 9). Our daily life and work for the benefit of our neighbors and our long-suffering Ukraine become work in the name of eternity. That is why war and every sin of destruction directed against peace-building is a sin against God. That is why our Orthodox Church constantly urges all Christians to do everything possible to preserve a just and lasting peace. On these Easter days, the days of the victory of life over death, I cordially greet you, Most Reverend Archpastors, God-loving pastors, honest monks and nuns, beloved brothers and sisters, as well as Ukrainians living outside Ukraine, with the great bright holiday of Christ's Resurrection. I especially congratulate and pray for our soldiers-defenders and the Ukrainian authorities. I pray that the Risen Christ will strengthen our mental and physical strength and give us the gracious power to endure all kinds of sorrows and do good deeds. Let nothing overshadow our spiritual joy. "Celebrating the renewal of our life," St. Gregory the Theologian teaches us, "let us be renewed spiritually as well!" In praying to the Risen Christ, we will ask Him to bless the Ukrainian people and give them mental and physical strength in times of hardship. We believe that just as Christ rose from the dead after suffering on the cross, so Ukraine will rise from the ordeal. We believe and know that good always triumphs over evil. We will also win with God's help. Christ is truly risen from the dead! Glory to him forever! Truly Christ is Risen! **PHILARET**







Bishop Luke's Sermon – Palm Sunday, April 17, 2022 John 12:1-18

Today we celebrate the first Palm Sunday when Jesus was hailed as the Messiah as he entered Jerusalem and palm branches were laid at his feet. Tomorrow is the start of Holy Week and a lot happens within a short period of time. The crowds who came to glorify Jesus today in Jerusalem shouted "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! The King of Israel!" Then soon afterwards, those same people who greeted Jesus with adoration and palms scream to the Romans CRUCIFY HIM! All this happens within one week. During Holy Week, as each day leads up to the Resurrection, it will be a difficult journey -- especially Holy Friday. Jesus, after his long walk carrying the cross on his back, is crucified and dies. We mourn on this day. In your daily life, reflect upon the human qualities of the disciples and the people in Jesus' life – and death. Put yourself in their places. Today, imagine yourself watching Jesus enter Jerusalem on the donkey. You know his fate – but you also know yours.

We rejoice today – but will cry later in the week – and then we will REJOICE AGAIN on Easter! AMEN.







READER: Brothers...The former account I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach, until the day in which He was taken up, after He through the Holy Spirit had given commandments to the apostles whom He had chosen, to whom He also presented Himself alive after His suffering by many infallible proofs, being seen by them during forty days and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God. And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, "which," He said, "you have heard from Me; for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now. Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, "Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. John bore witness of Him and cried out, saying, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me is preferred before me, for He was before me.' "And of His fullness we have all received, and grace for grace. For the law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.. (John 1:1-17)
