


The Gospels record the faithfulness of Christ's women disciples at the Cross. The women went to the tomb to anoint Jesus' body with myrrh-oils and spices but found the tomb empty. As they wondered what this meant, angels appeared proclaiming that Christ had risen from the dead. So the "myrrh-bearing women"


were the first to find out about Christ's Resurrection. This event is celebrated in the Orthodox church on the third Sunday after Pascha. Holy tradition names eight myrrh-bearers: the Virgin Mary; Mary Magdalene; Mary, the wife of Cleophas; Joanna, mother of the sons of Zebedee, James and John; Susanna; Mary, the sister of Lazarus; Martha, the sister of Lazarus.



Scripture Reading for Sunday, April 30 - Mark 15:43-16:8

CHRIST IS RISEN! On this day, the third Sunday of Pascha, we celebrate the feast of the Holy Myrrh-Bearing Women. And we also commemorate Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus, two prominent Jewish leaders who were also secret disciples of Christ. Joseph, a rich and noble man, dared to ask Pilate for the body of Jesus, which he took and buried in his own tomb.

Accompanying Joseph was Nicodemus who brought myrrh and aloes to scent and embalm the body of Christ. Later, the women arrived at the tomb on Holy Pascha to anoint His body, only to discover it empty. These were all ordinary people who took action, compelled by their love for Jesus, risking retribution from the authorities and the public, risking their lives and safety to do what needed to be done. The message in today's Scripture reading can be summed up as "humble service." We must do as the myrrh-bearing women and two men did -- by serving Jesus with humility. And there are countless opportunities and practical acts to serve Christ, His Church, our neighbors, or any needy person. If we want to experience the glory of this Pascha season and make Easter more than a cultural celebration, we must follow the example of those courageous and loving women and men we commemorate today. CHRIST IS RISEN!

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, APRIL 30, 2023

SUNDAY OF THE MYRRH-BEARING WOMEN

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 6th Tone: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance!

CHOIR: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance!

READER: To Thee, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! O Lord, save Thy people.

CHOIR: And bless Thine inheritance!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Acts of the Holy Apostles.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Now in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying, there arose a complaint against the Hebrews by the Hellenists, because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution. Then the twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables. Therefore, brethren, seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business; but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word. And the saying pleased the whole multitude. And they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch, whom they set before the apostles; and when they had prayed, they laid hands on them. Then the word of God spread, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith. (Acts 6:1-7)

PRIEST: Peace be unto thee, Reader.

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: Alleluia! Alleluia! CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

READER: He who dwells in the shelter of the Most-High will abide in the shadow of the heavenly God!

He will say to the Lord: "My Protector and my Refuge; my God, in whom I trust!

CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

PRIEST: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent council member, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, coming and taking courage, went in to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Pilate marveled that He was already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him if He had been dead for some time. So when he found out from the centurion, he granted the body to Joseph. Then he bought fine linen, took Him down, and wrapped Him in the linen. And he laid Him in a tomb which had been hewn out of the rock, and rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. And Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses observed where He was laid. Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away-for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples-and Peter-that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you. So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. (Mark 15:43-16:8)

Priest:

O God Omnipotent and Lord Almighty, who by thy servant Moses, at the exodus of Israel from Egypt, and the liberation of thy people form the bitter bondage of Pharaoh, didst command that a Lamb be slain, foreshadowing the Lamb which, because of our deeds, of his own good will, was slain on the cross, and taketh away the sins of the whole world, thy beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ: Do thou now, also, we humbly entreat thee, look upon this bread, and bless and sanctify it. For we thy servants, in honour, and glory, and commemoration of the glorious Resurrection of the same, thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom, also, we have received freedom and release from the eternal works of the enemy and the indissoluble bonds of Hell, now before thy majesty, on this exceeding bright, and all-glorious, and saving day of Easter, do offer this. Vouchsafe that we who offer it, and those who shall kiss it and shall taste of it may be partakers of thy heavenly benediction; and by thy might root out from us all sickness and infirmity, granting health unto all. For thou art the source of blessing, and the bestower of health, and unto thee do we ascribe glory, to the Father who is from everlasting, together with thine Only-begotten Son, and thine all-holy, and good, and life-giving Spirit, now, and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

And immediately the Priest sprinkleth the Artos with holy water, saying:

This Artos is blessed and hallowed by the sprinkling of this holy water, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. (*Thrice*)
