

# **Saint Mary of Egypt**

On the 5<sup>th</sup> **Sunday of Great Lent,** April 5, the Church commemorates the life of St. Mary of Egypt, who formerly a great sinner, is intended to serve as an example of true repentance and convince us of the profound compassion of God.

The history of this Saint was related by Hieromonk Zossima when he met her during a Great Lenten journey in the wilderness.



St. Mary was born in Egypt, and for 17 years from the age of 12, had lived as a prostitute. While in Jerusalem, she attempted to enter a church but an unseen power prevented her from doing so. She turned to an icon of the Mother of God at the entrance, prayed before it and then entered without fear. Upon leaving, she heard a voice, "If you cross the Jordan, you will find true peace." She then retreated to the desert, renounced her worldly desires and lived as a hermit in penitence for the next 48 years. Her life story reminds us how the Lord glorifies repentant sinners.


We began live-streaming services this past Sunday, March 29, at Divine Liturgy. Details about our new Virtual St. Nicholas Church are on page 4.






Father Bohdan's Sermon – Sunday, March 29, 2020 Mark 9:17-31

In Biblical times, there were no names for the many physical and psychological ailments that our bodies and minds suffer from. And so the word "demons" described the disturbing and confusing maladies that struck people - as we hear in today's Scripture reading. And Jesus Christ said that only through prayer and fasting could the demon be cast out and the soul and body healed. Think of prayer and fasting as "spiritual first aid" - treating the whole person, that is, body, soul, and spirit. Prior to casting out the demonic spirit, Jesus looked at the father in today's Scripture reading and said, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes." The father was completely and totally honest admitting that he had unbelief, that he did not have complete faith and trust. 'Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!', he cried. Yet Jesus healed his son without there being the type of faith that you would think you need for this miracle to happen. The father clearly said that he had doubts. So why did Jesus heal this man's son? Perhaps because the man was honest. Once we are honest about our doubts, we must, like the father in today's Scripture reading, confess them. Confession begins the process of turning away from doubts -- to believing and having unwavering faith. And that is called repentance. AMEN.



On Sunday, March 15, 2020, in response to the quarantine measures to prevent the spread of coronavirus, His Holiness Patriarch Philaret blessed all churches of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the Kyiv Patriarchate to include intensified and special prayers for deliverance from the global pandemic. Consequently, Father Bohdan will say the following prayer during Divine Liturgy. His Holiness instructed that it is also a blessing to include this prayer in your morning and evening prayers at home:



"O Lord our God, God of our salvation, look with mercy upon Your humble servants. We have sinned before You, but do not punish us and the world with malady and disease. Turn away Your anger from Your servants. Take away Your terrible sword, which is righteously lifted up against us, Your poor and weak servants. Do not punish us, O Merciful Lord, for our iniquities, foolishness, pride and impatience with one another, for our wickedness and insincere, false love. Lord, Jesus Christ our God, though you punish, you also show mercy as the Father of the Prodigal Son. Remember the great sufferings of Your people, the persecution of the Church, the exiled and the tortured, and because we did not lose faith in You, the only True God, in suffering and in captivity, we pray that You have compassion on us now. We thank You for Your mercy and Your boundless love. Although we sin before You, we serve You only. And now, look upon us, O Lord of Love, forgive our trespasses and deliver us from sickness. Be merciful. Your Church, for which You shed Your blood on the Cross, prays to You. Forgive us so that we may always glorify Your holy name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen."

**READER:** And to thy spirit.

**PRIEST:** Wisdom!

READER: Alleluia! Alleluia! CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

**READER**: God gives vengeance unto me and subdues people under me!

He magnifies the salvation of the king and deals mercifully with Christ, with David and his seed forever.

CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

**PRIEST**: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

**CHOIR**: And to thy spirit.

**PRIEST**: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark.

**CHOIR**: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. Now they were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was going before them; and they were amazed. And as they followed they were afraid. Then He took the twelve aside again and began to tell them the things that would happen to Him: Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and to the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and deliver Him to the Gentiles; and they will mock Him, and scourge Him, and spit on Him, and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again. Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Him, saying, "Teacher, we want You to do for us whatever we ask." And He said to them, "What do you want Me to do for you?" They said to Him, "Grant us that we may sit, one on Your right hand and the other on Your left, in Your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you ask. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They said to Him, "We are able." So Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink the cup that I drink, and with the baptism I am baptized with you will be baptized; but to sit on My right hand and on My left is not Mine to give, but it is for those for whom it is prepared. And when the ten heard it, they began to be greatly displeased with James and John. But Jesus called them to Himself and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. Yet it shall not be so among you; but whoever desires to become great among you shall be your servant. And whoever of you desires to be first shall be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many. (Mark 10:32-45)
