Fast, Pray, Give Alms, Repent in contemplation of the life of the Mother of God... in preparation for the Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos



Mid-Summer. August.

In our secular life, the winding down of summer is synonymous with students and teachers preparing for the return to school.

In our church life, the Dormition Fast reminds us that it is August and time to prepare for the Feast of the Falling Asleep of the Holy Theotokos, the Mother of God, this year on Sunday, August 28.

The Dormition Fast is short in duration – only two weeks – a time devoted to reflecting on the life of the Holy Theotokos and praying that we may live a life in imitation of her.

During Divine Liturgy, the Choir sings the "Hymn to the Theotokos" -- when Bishop Luke enters the Cathedral and venerates the holy icons -- and following the Holy Anaphora during Divine Liturgy.

"It is truly meet to bless you,
O Theotokos,
Ever blessed and most pure and
the Mother of our God.
More honorable than the
Cherubim,
And more glorious beyond
compare than the Seraphim.
Without defilement you gave
birth to God the Word.
O Theotokos, we magnify you."

There are a couple of ARCHAIC words in the prayer that need explanation:

It is truly **meet**... **Meet** in this context means "proper, fitting, correct."

We **magnify** you. **Magnify** means "glorify."

On Tuesday, August 2, 2022, Bishop Luke completed an intensive and challenging training program to become an **American Heart Association-certified BLS (Basic Life Support)**

INSTRUCTOR. Bishop Luke previously was certified by the AHA to just administer CPR, but now he is certified to teach others adult and pediatric CPR/AED and ECC (emergency cardiovascular care). Down the road, Bishop Luke plans to organize a CPR class in the St. Nicholas Cathedral Hall to certify parishioners and others who would like to learn life-saving CPR. And soon we will have an AED (automated external defibrillator) available in the Cathedral.

Bishop Luke's Sermon Sun., August 7, 2022 Matthew 14:14-22

Today's Scripture reading is about another miracle Jesus performed and one that has been told to us often: Jesus feeds





5,000 people with only 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish. How was this possible? In God's kingdom there is enough of everything for everyone. In our daily lives, Jesus always seems to be asking more of us than we have to give--- as spouses, as parents, as students, as workers, as a congregation...and on and on. He calls on us to love, even when love is difficult; to forgive, even when we have been badly wronged; to hold fast and firm to our principles, even when it means standing alone. And those things are not easy to do. After all, we are not Jesus, and our powers are limited. We have only 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish! But God's abundance is right here, right now, with us all the time! Even though we think we don't have enough -- enough strength, enough faith, enough energy, enough love -- God will give us what we need when we need it. Always think of the 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish feeding 5,000 people! The disciple Matthew counsels us in Chapter 6: "Do not be anxious saying what shall we eat? what shall we drink? what shall we wear? Your heavenly Father already knows your needs. Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and all these things shall be yours." AMEN.



THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, AUGUST 14, 2022

9TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 8th Tone: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

CHOIR: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

READER: In Judah God is known. His Name is great in Israel! Pray and make your vows.

CHOIR: Before the Lord our God!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Corinthians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, you are God's building. According to the grace of God which was given to me, as a wise master builder I have laid the foundation, and another builds on it. But let each one take heed how he builds on it. For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. If anyone's work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire. Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are. **(1 Corinthians 3:9-17)**

And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. Now when evening came, He was alone there. But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary. Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out for fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid." And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." So He said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!" And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, "Truly You are the Son of God." When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret. (Matthew 14:22-34)
