The icon arrived in Philadelphia and was placed on the center analoi in St. Nicholas Church. Father Bohdan blessed the icon on Sunday, May 6.



Father Bohdan's Sermon Sunday, August 8, 2021 Matthew 9:27-35

> Po You Want To Be Healed?

In today's Scripture reading, Jesus had a very busy day: He gave sight to two blind men; he enabled a mute man to speak; and He cast out demons! Whereas the multitudes were amazed at Jesus' unique power, the self-important and resentful Pharisees thought the opposite. In their eyes, Jesus could do nothing right. Matthew writes in Verse 34 that the Pharisees said the only reason Jesus could cast out the demons was BECAUSE HE WAS SATAN HIMSELF! Let this verse be a reminder that to the arrogant and self-righteous, proof of your good works does not matter. Look at Jesus...He performed a remarkable series of miracles. You would think that no one would be angry with Him when they witnessed the Lord's wonderful works. NOT SO! The Pharisees questioned, debated, and ridiculed Jesus even though they saw people being healed and lives changed right in front of them. Their scorn and disbelief were based not on insufficient evidence but on their jealousy of Jesus. Yet, as we know, their resentment did not stop Jesus from performing miracles. And so it should be with us. If your heart is pure and your intentions are good, let nothing stop you from doing good works for the glory of God. AMEN.


This year, we will be selling bags of candy with our new Pierogi Festival label.




Flyers and posters have already been printed and are ready for you to hand out to friends – and hang in store windows.


