
Donate a new VEHICLE PARKING BLOCK!


After the parking lot is re-paved, new reflective parking blocks will be installed. We need 36 blocks. Each one is \$55.00. Please donate one...or more! Thank you!

The majority of our building projects are driven by SAFETY CONCERNS. For example, last year we installed an ADT fire alarm system for the first time in our 103-year history -- in addition to 9 security cameras to monitor the exterior of the building and our Church Hall.

This year, various critical electrical issues came to our attention when circuits kept tripping. We want to fix these issues, and just received a quote from Shelly Electric for \$7,451.00. Please consider a donation to offset the cost of these much-needed electrical repairs and upgrades.

















Another safety concern was a menacing spruce tree leaning precariously towards the Rectory. The tree needed to be removed and Tom's Tree Service came to the rescue! In 1-1/2 hours, Tom and his crew cut down the huge spruce to ground level. The price was \$1,150.00 – and a donor came forward to take care of the cost.

After the delivery of the Amish shed next month, more manageable ornamental trees will be planted on the north side of our building to provide shade and beauty.



#### Father Bohdan's Sermon – Sunday, July 26 Matthew 9:27-35

In today's Scripture reading, Jesus had a very busy day: He gave sight to two blind men; he enabled a mute man to speak; and He cast out demons! Although He told the blind men not to speak to anyone about the miracle, the men disobeyed him. Full of joy about the healing, the men immediately spread the news to everyone that Jesus was the Messiah! Whereas the multitudes were amazed at Jesus' unique power, the self-important and resentful Pharisees thought the opposite. In their eyes, Jesus could do nothing right. Matthew writes in Verse 34 that the Pharisees said the only reason Jesus could cast out the demons was BECAUSE HE WAS SATAN HIMSELF!



Let this verse be a reminder that to the arrogant and self-righteous, proof of the good works you do does not matter. Look at Jesus...He performed a remarkable series of miracles. You would think that no one would be angry with Him when they witnessed the Lord's wonderful works. NOT SO! The Pharisees questioned, debated, and ridiculed Jesus even though they saw people being healed and lives changed right in front of them. Their scorn and disbelief were based not on insufficient evidence but on their jealousy of Jesus. Yet, as we know, their resentment did not stop Jesus from performing miracles. And so it should be us. If your heart is pure and your intentions are good, do not be stopped by the envy of others. AMEN.

### THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, AUGUST 2

8<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

**READER**: And to thy spirit.

**PRIEST**: Wisdom!

**READER:** The Prokeimenon in the 7th Tone: The Lord shall give strength to His people! The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

**CHOIR:** The Lord shall give strength to His people! The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

**READER**: Offer to the Lord, O ye sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord! The Lord shall give strength to His people!

**CHOIR**: The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

**PRIEST**: Wisdom!

**READER**: The reading is from the Corinthians.

**PRIEST**: Let us attend!

**READER**: Brothers...Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment. For it has been declared to me concerning you, my brethren, by those of Chloe's household, that there are contentions among you. Now I say this, that each of you says, "I am of Paul," or "I am of Apollos," or "I am of Cephas," or "I am of Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, lest anyone should say that I had baptized in my own name. Yes, I also baptized the household of Stephanas. Besides, I do not know whether I baptized any other. For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the gospel, not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of no effect. For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. (**Corinthians 1:10-18**)

**PRIEST**: Let us attend. And when Jesus went out He saw a great multitude; and He was moved with compassion for them, and healed their sick. When it was evening, His disciples came to Him, saying, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is already late. Send the multitudes away, that they may go into the villages and buy themselves food." But Jesus said to them, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." And they said to Him, "We have here only five loaves and two fish." He said, "Bring them here to Me." Then He commanded the multitudes to sit down on the grass. And He took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, He blessed and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples; and the disciples gave to the multitudes. So they all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of the fragments that remained. Now those who had eaten were about five thousand men, besides women and children. Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away. (Matthew 14:14-22)
