


"Holy Tradition tells us that all the Apostles, with the exception of St. Thomas, were transported mystically to Jerusalem in order to be with the Mother of God - the Theotokos – as she reposed, and to be present at her burial. When Apostle Thomas arrived the next day, the Apostles opened the tomb so that he could kiss her farewell. As the tomb was opened, the body of the Most Pure Virgin was missing, and the cave was filled with flowers and the sweet fragrance of Paradise. This was a sure sign of her great purity and holiness to the faithful.

"Therefore as part of our celebration of Dormition we bless flowers and fragrant herbs — and the faithful traditionally keep them in their homes. The herbs, used as natural medicine, are blessed in commemoration of the numerous healings and the extraordinary grace bestowed on the pilgrims at the blessed tomb of the Mother of God. During times of family strife or illness, it is a pious custom to place the flower petals in the house censer, together with the incense, and cense the whole house with it."

Sunday's Scripture Reading

Matthew 19:16-26

Sunday's Scripture reading is the story of a young man, a good man, who followed God's commandments and who had everything -- except one thing: the assurance of eternal life.



He was not absolutely sure that he was "right with God." And his worry was justified. Whatever you love the most, serve most, seek out most, give to the most, worship the most and care about the most is your god. Your "god" can be your career, your bank account, the way you look, a particular status, influence, power, or physical pleasure. Your "god" is whatever you allow to control you, to be the ultimate guide to decision-making, the place of your supreme loyalty, and the source of your self-worth. Jesus revealed to the young man that he was NOT good enough for God, despite his wealth. And sadly, after hearing this, the man then made the wrong decision. He walked away from Jesus. Jesus summarized the man's actions perfectly with these familiar words: it is easier for a camel to enter the eye of a needle than for a rich man to get into Heaven. In astonishment, the disciples asked: who then can be saved? ".....with God all things are possible," answered Jesus.

## MESSAGE FROM CATHEDRAL COUNCIL PRESIDENT: TOM HANNEY



Greetings! I hope everyone is having an enjoyable summer. There's never summer vacation at St. Nicholas Cathedral. It's business as usual, all year round. We are even busier in the summer as that is when the Festival Director, Judy Hanney, and her team, start preparing for our biggest annual fundraiser of the year: the PIEROGI FESTIVAL, this year on Saturday, November 4, and Sunday, November 5.

Published next to this message is the food prep schedule for the Festival. We expect to have dozens of parishioners at every session.

Most of the year we come and go as individuals, with very busy everyday schedules. But at this time of the year, we ask you to perform a Labor of Love for God and your Church. This is about working as a team and having the dedication of a team to succeed. Do this now! Mark it a Priority! Make Saint Nicholas a Priority! Choose as many dates as possible and dedicate yourself to being there for your team.

Showing up when there is work to be done says you are truly a member of Saint Nicholas. Not showing up says you are just a visitor.

The money raised from the Festival will pay the utility bills for the Cathedral and the Rectory. The true cost of operating the Cathedral is approximately \$16,000 per month. If you are unable to put anything in the collection basket, this is the time to contribute to the Cathedral with your labor – and chop onions, steam cabbage, pinch pierogi. And work at the Festival. If you attended Divine Liturgy and find serenity and a heightened spirituality, this is the time to give thanks and work as a team to achieve our financial goal.

12<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**READER**: The reading is from the Corinthians.

**PRIEST**: Let us attend!

**READER**: Brothers...Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received and in which you stand, by which also you are saved, if you hold fast that word which I preached to you-unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures, and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve. After that He was seen by over five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep. After that He was seen by James, then by all the apostles. Then last of all He was seen by me also, as by one born out of due time. For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me. Therefore, whether it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed. (1 Corinthians 15:1-11)
