"Holy Tradition tells us that all the Apostles, with the exception of St. Thomas, were transported mystically to Jerusalem in order to be with the Mother of God – the Theotokos – as she reposed, and to be present at her burial. When Apostle Thomas arrived the next day, the Apostles opened the tomb so that he could kiss her farewell. As the tomb was opened, the body of the Most Pure Virgin was missing, and the cave was filled with flowers and the sweet fragrance of Paradise. This was a sure sign of her great purity and holiness to the faithful.

"Therefore as part of our celebration of Dormition we bless flowers and fragrant herbs – and the faithful traditionally keep them in their homes. The herbs, used as natural medicine, are blessed in commemoration of the numerous healings and the extraordinary grace bestowed on the pilgrims at the blessed tomb of the Mother of God. During times of family strife or illness, it is a pious custom to place the flower petals in the house censer, together with the incense, and cense the whole house with it."



Weekly offering envelopes for the Church Year September 2022 to August 2023 are ready for pick-up by the Candle Room.


Long-standing Members: Your boxes are marked with your names.

Bishop Luke's Sermon - Sunday, August 21, 2022

Today we commemorate the Feast of the Holy Transfiguration of the Lord, although the actual holiday on the calendar was this past Friday, August 19. The Gospels tell that Jesus took three of His disciples - John, James and Peter -- up a mountain where they witnessed His transfiguration - His change -- into divine form: His face shone like the sun, His garments became brilliantly white as snow, and a voice from heaven proclaimed that this was the Son of God. In the Transfiguration, the disciples see the majesty of the Kingdom of God present in the person of Christ. The Church gives us comfort by showing us that after the temporary sorrows with which our earthly life is filled, the glory of eternal blessedness will be ours. And the end of summer is an appropriate time to celebrate this Feast as it is customary to bless the crop of a first harvest on this day. The blessing of grapes, fruits and vegetables is symbolic of the final transfiguration of all things. Just as fruits ripen and are transformed under the hot summer sun, so is man called to a spiritual transfiguration through the light of God's word. We pray to God to sanctify both the souls and the bodies of those who eat these fruits, to keep their lives peaceful and joyful, and to multiply these fruits abundantly. AMEN.

BUILDING FUND PROJECT: Paint the interior walls of the Sanctuary; repair the damaged icons and ceiling ornamentation

It is hard not to notice the peeling plaster on the walls of the Sanctuary. Each week there seems to be another crumbling white patch in need of repair. Now that the building has been waterproofed, it is time to tackle this project. Hawthorne Painting (John and his team did a fabulous job painting the exterior of our Cathedral building) will repair and paint the walls.

And after a long search, we have found an iconographer — Ekaterina Piskareva — who will inspect our icons next month and give us a proposal to repair the damaged icons and wall art. Please take a look at her website: piskarevarestorations.com

We are also taking this opportunity to CHANGE the wall color from the current dark purple-mauve to possibly a brighter rose-gold shade that will complement the faux marble on the iconostas.

READER: The reading is from the Philippians.

READER: Brothers...Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. **(Philippians 2:5-11)**
