

Father Bohdan's Sermon

Sunday, Nov. 24, 2019 Luke 10:25-37

In today's Scripture reading, Jesus talks with some of His curious followers, and one man, a religious scholar, asks: What do I need to do to have eternal life? And Jesus answered: Love God above all and love your neighbor as yourself. And then He proceeded to tell him about the Good Samaritan, a Bible story we are all familiar with. Jesus uses the story to illustrate that a neighbor is not just who happens to be living next door to you, across the fence or across the street.

A neighbor is ANYONE that God puts in your path. Anyone who is in front of us who may be in need and is in pain. Anyone we encounter. The Scripture reading makes it clear that loving God means loving people. But it is so much easier to love God than to love others, isn't it? Just as it is easier to love mankind than an individual man with all his glaring faults, flaws and imperfections, or a neighbor who is rude, disrespectful, vulgar. No one said keeping God's commandments was easy. However, we never stop trying. This week is the start of the Nativity Season and our Orthodox teachings encourage us to be more prayerful, to fast -- and to be charitable. That means we show mercy and compassion. When you are compassionate, you feel something and then you do something about it. So in the spirit of this benevolent Nativity Season, look around you -- be a Good Samaritan -- and love your neighbor. AMEN.
