


Bishop Luke's

Sermon

In today's Scripture reading Jesus was criticized because He healed a sick woman on the Sabbath - on a Sunday - the day we devote to worshipping God. He was told that His act of healing was in fact work and He broke the Sabbath rules. Jesus responded by calling His accuser a hypocrite and asked: which is lawful on the Sabbath - to do good or to do evil, to save life or to destroy it? So what can we learn about the Sabbath in this Scripture reading? First, that Sunday is not an ordinary day and we must respect And second, doing sanctity. good for others on the Sabbath is condoned.

this fast-paced, modern world, sometimes we are called upon to work on a Sunday. Think of hospital workers. emergency response teams. businesses. newspapers, utilities. For those Sunday workers who have faith, they know to start the day with prayer, and to thank God for their jobs.

On the other hand, there is no condoning those who are sleeping Sunday morning. Or those who are watching television or playing games on the internet. individuals who know that Liturgy celebrated and do not take a moment to pray even in house Sunday morning. Those individuals who should know better because they were raised in the Orthodox faith. So the message in today's Scripture reading is that when vou believer, you are held to a higher standard. Keep the Sabbath holy. And if you find vourself working on Sunday - do an honorable job - with prayer - for the glory of God. AMEN.

27TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Ephesians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. **(Ephesians 6:10-17)**

PRIEST: Let us attend. Now He was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath. And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up. But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, "Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity." And He laid His hands on her, and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God. But the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath; and he said to the crowd, "There are six days on which men ought to work; therefore come and be healed on them, and not on the Sabbath day." The Lord then answered him and said, "Hypocrite! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or donkey from the stall, and lead it away to water it? So ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound-think of it-for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath? And when He said these things, all His adversaries were put to shame; and all the multitude rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by Him. (Luke 13:10-17)
