More than 100 years ago, our ancestors composed documents to establish, incorporate and govern
St. Nicholas Church. Among those documents are our Church's By-Laws and Statutes.

Article 3, THE CHURCH'S PATRON SAINT, states: "The day in commemoration of

St. Nicholas....should be regarded as the Church Patron's Feast and should be solemnized and respected as such every year."

And so every year -- for 105 years -- the St. Nicholas Cathedral Parish has honored our forefathers' mandate. As a congregation we will celebrate the Feast Day of St. Nicholas, our Patron Saint, on Sunday, December 18, with a Moleben to St. Nicholas immediately after Divine Liturgy, followed by a fellowship lunch in our Cathedral Hall.

St. Nicholas was born into a wealthy Christian family. From an early age, he knew that he would devote his life to God. His uncle, Bishop of Patara, ordained him a priest, and he was later consecrated an Archbishop.

Because of the many miracles attributed to his intercession, St. Nicholas is also known as Nicholas the Wonderworker. He is the patron saint of sailors, children, travelers, and we pray to him for deliverance from floods, poverty, or any misfortunes. His generosity and gift-giving inspired the creation of Santa Claus.



The Scripture Reading for Sunday, December 18, 2022 Luke 17:12-19

Today's Scripture reading is about being thankful. Ten lepers encounter Jesus and ask for mercy. Jesus shows them mercy, heals them – and the men go on their way. However, one of them returns to Jesus, overwhelmed and overjoyed that his health was restored -- and eager to give thanks and



glorify God. BUT WHERE ARE THE OTHER NINE? Jesus asked. And this rhetorical question makes us contemplate and wonder what is Jesus really thinking? He does not preach that the nine lepers He healed were ungrateful. Rather, the Scripture reading encourages us to learn from these nine lepers — or rather learn from that one leper who made the effort to RETURN to Jesus to thank Him. How often do we fervently pray for something: restored health, good fortune, a promotion, a new house or car, a new opportunity — and then when our prayers are answered, we move on like the NINE and ignore the blessings of the Lord. Or do we stop and offer thanks to the Lord like the ONE? Today's Scripture reading reminds us to do this: thank the Lord. It is vitally important to be sincerely thankful and express gratitude for your blessings. This spirit of gratitude can deepen your spiritual life. And your gratitude and thankfulness can influence others around you to thank the Lord as well!

27TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. **(Ephesians 6:10-17)**

And He said to him, "Arise, go your way. Your faith has made you well." **(Luke 17:12-19)**
