




Gramotas and The St. Volodymyr Cavalier Honor Are Bestowed Upon Father Bohdan



Father Bohdan's Sermon

Sunday, December 20, 2020

Luke 6:17-23

The verses in today's Scripture should sound familiar to you. They are the Beatitudes, and you hear the Choir sing them at the beginning of Divine Liturgy every Sunday. "Blessed are the poor; blessed are the hungry; blessed are those who weep; blessed are those who are hated....." Today I am giving my sermon -- not elevated on the stairs of the altar -- but here in the center of the Sanctuary, on the same level as you – just as Jesus did. Saint Luke says: "And He came down....and stood on a level place...with His disciples and a great multitude of people" who were healed as they listened to Jesus. Why did Saint Luke think it important to tell us this? Because the Beatitudes speak to all of us, to you, to me, to everyone. We are equal, all on the same level. The next time you hear the Choir sing the Beatitudes, listen closely. We are all promised spiritual blessings. The final verse tells us so: "Rejoice and be exceedingly glad for great is your reward in Heaven." As you know, today is the Feast Day of our Patron Saint Nicholas. Prior to sainthood, Nicholas was a very generous man, a priest and then a Bishop. So virtuous and giving was St. Nicholas that his life was the inspiration for Santa Claus. Teach your children to believe in St. Nicholas, his generosity and kindness – and that every day is an opportunity to give gifts to others. The gift of kindness, empathy, compassion, forgiveness, friendship, love and prayer -- things not material – are the blessed way to eternal rewards, just as the Beatitudes teach us. AMEN.
