

The Scripture Reading for Sunday, December 4, 2022 Luke 10:38-42; 11:27-28

Sunday's Scripture reading is a factual narrative from the daily life of Jesus. The reading focuses on the two most well-known sisters in the Bible and perhaps in history: MARY and MARTHA. And like sisters in today's world, they experienced sibling rivalry -- competing for the attention of Jesus. It is interesting how Jesus handles the situation and His explanation to Martha. It is a teachable moment for her – and for us. Mary is mentioned only about 3 times in the entire Bible, but every time she is. Mary is sitting dutifully and lovingly at the feet of Jesus. mesmerized. She adores Him, reveres Him, hanging on His every word. Martha, on the other hand, is a busy lady. She is devoted to Jesus, too, in her own way, tending to Him, serving food, cleaning up. And of course, a busy person does not look fondly upon the person who sits idly. And that is why Martha was annoyed with Mary. She asked Jesus to make Mary help her. Jesus' answer: MARY HAS CHOSEN THAT GOOD PART WHICH WILL NOT BE TAKEN AWAY FROM HER. BLESSED ARE THOSE WHO HEAR THE WORD OF GOD AND KEEP IT!" So Mary's faith - her submissive obedience -- is what pleased Jesus more than Martha's devoted service. Jesus did not condemn Martha for her service but asked her to work on her faith...perfect her faith. Let the lesson to us be this: do not let everyday duties, responsibilities and tasks distract you from your faith in God. Keep a balance in your life. Make Bible study and prayer a part of your daily activities.

The Cathedral Kitchen was bustling as turkeys were carved, dinner rolls warmed, potatoes mashed. The bountiful Thanksgiving table included 3 roasted turkeys, 10 pounds of mashed potatoes, 6 pounds of carrots, baked ham, stuffing and much more – all food donated and cooked by parishioners of the Cathedral. Special thanks to Judy and Tom Hanney, Colleen Philipp, Barbara and George Latsios, Ellen and Phil Hanavin, John and Susie Sobchak, and all those who brought their favorite dishes and cakes.



Following the blessing of the food by Bishop Luke, Tom Hanney, Cathedral Council President, took the opportunity to explain the meaning of Thanksgiving to our Ukrainian refugee guests, comparing the long, arduous journey of the Pilgrims on the Mayflower to the New World with the flight of the refugees to Philadelphia from war-torn Ukraine.



Alla Pukhtetska, who is fluent in English and arrived with Veronika Matviienko in Philadelphia from Kyiv (via Warsaw) in March 2022 soon after the war started in Ukraine, heartfully expressed her thanks to the American people, and especially to Bishop Luke and the parishioners of St. Nicholas Cathedral, for welcoming them, giving them rooms in the Cathedral Rectory, and for their ongoing emotional and financial support.











48 people – family, friends, friends of friends! – came together in the Cathedral Hall to break bread, give thanks, and enjoy good fellowship on this very American holiday. Tom Hanney reminded us in his welcoming speech that back in 1863, President Abraham Lincoln encouraged Americans to recognize the last Thursday of November as "a day of Thanksgiving." A few years later in 1870, Congress followed suit by passing legislation making

Thanksgiving an official national holiday.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, DECEMBER 4, 2022

25TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 8th Tone: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

CHOIR: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

READER: In Judah God is known. His Name is great in Israel! Pray and make your vows.

CHOIR: Before the Lord our God!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Hebrews.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Then indeed, even the first covenant had ordinances of divine service and the earthly sanctuary. For a tabernacle was prepared: the first part, in which was the lampstand, the table, and the showbread, which is called the sanctuary; and behind the second veil, the part of the tabernacle which is called the Holiest of All, which had the golden censer and the ark of the covenant overlaid on all sides with gold, in which were the golden pot that had the manna, Aaron's rod that budded, and the tablets of the covenant; and above it were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat. Of these things we cannot now speak in detail. Now when these things had been thus prepared, the priests always went into the first part of the tabernacle, performing the services. But into the second part the high priest went alone once a year, not without blood, which he offered for himself and for the people's sins committed in ignorance. (**Hebrews 9:1-7**)

PRIEST: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. Now it happened as they went that He entered a certain village; and a certain woman named Martha welcomed Him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who also sat at Jesus' feet and heard His word. But Martha was distracted with much serving, and she approached Him and said, "Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Therefore tell her to help me." And Jesus answered and said to her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things. But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her. And it happened, as He spoke these things, that a certain woman from the crowd raised her voice and said to Him, "Blessed is the womb that bore You, and the breasts which nursed You!" But He said, "More than that, blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it!" **(Luke 10:38-42; 11:27-28)**
