The Presentation of the Most Holy Theotokos — the entry of the Blessed Virgin Mary at the age of 3 into the Temple in Jerusalem — is one of the 12 great feasts in the Orthodox Church and is celebrated on Saturday, December 4, 2021.

We commemorate when Mary's parents, Anna and Joachim, giving thanks for the birth of their daughter (having been childless for so long), brought her to the Temple where she remained until she was 12. The Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple signifies her total dedication to God and her future calling as the Mother of our Lord.

"The day in commemoration of St. Nicholas....should be regarded as the Church Patron's Feast and should be solemnized and respected as such every year."



St. Nicholas was born into a wealthy Christian family. From an early age, he knew that he would devote his life to God. His uncle, Bishop of Patara, ordained him a priest, and he was later consecrated an Archbishop. Because of the many miracles attributed to his intercession, St. Nicholas is also known as Nicholas the Wonderworker. He is the patron saint of sailors, children, travelers, and we pray to him for deliverance from floods, poverty, or any misfortunes. His generosity and gift-giving inspired the creation of Santa Claus.





Father Luke's Sermon Sunday, November 28, 2021 Luke 10:25-37

In today's Scripture reading, Jesus talks with some of his curious followers, and one man, a religious scholar, asks:

What do I need to do to have eternal life? And Jesus answered: Love God above all and love your neighbor as yourself.

And then He proceeded to tell him about the Good Samaritan, a Bible story we are all familiar with. Jesus uses the story to illustrate that a neighbor is not just who happens to be living next door to you, across the fence or across the street. A neighbor is ANYONE that God puts in your path. Anyone who is in front of us that may be in need and is in pain. Anyone we encounter. The Scripture reading makes it clear that loving God means loving people. But it is so much easier to love God than to love others, isn't it? Just as it is easier to love mankind than an individual man with all his glaring faults, flaws and imperfections, or a neighbor who is rude, disrespectful, vulgar. No one said keeping God's commandments was easy. However, we never stop trying. Today is the start of the Nativity Season and our Orthodox teachings encourage us to be more prayerful, to fast -- and to be charitable. That means we show mercy and compassion. When you are compassionate, you feel something and then you do something about it. So in the spirit of this benevolent Nativity Season, look around you - be a Good Samaritan -- and love your neighbor. AMEN.

# ESREAKING MANUEL MANUEL


When someone gives you an unexpected gift, what do you do?

Michael has offered to donate and install – at absolutely no cost to the Cathedral – new ceramic, 20" square floor tiles in our Sanctuary. Beautiful white marble tiles will flank a center aisle of bronze-colored tiles. Michael expects to start and finish this project prior to Christmas! WHAT A GIFT to St. Nicholas Cathedral! This is an exciting facelift for the interior of our Sanctuary. The dark brown linoleum floor will not be torn up. It will be covered with the new large tiles. This will minimize dust and disruption to our worship services. The icons, candlestands and furnishings will be protected with plastic drop cloths during the project.

The interior iconography in the Sanctuary is flaking. The interior walls of our stairwells are crumbling. We need to correct this problem immediately. Painting the exterior walls of the building with special elastomeric paint will stop the water seepage. This is the last step in our efforts to WATERPROOF our beautiful Cathedral building. Contractors estimate this job will cost \$20,000.

24<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**PRIEST:** Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

**READER**: And to thy spirit.

**READER:** Brothers...For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity. And He came and preached peace to you who were afar off and to those who were near. For through Him we both have access by one Spirit to the Father. Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, in whom the whole building, being fitted together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.
