## Nativity Fast November 28-January 6

Fasting is an integral part of our Orthodox life. The Nativity Fast has begun to prepare us for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. During the next 6 weeks, we will focus on fasting, prayer and acts of charity. The purpose of fasting is not to suffer. On the contrary, fasting is healthy for both soul and body. During the fast, our physical and spiritual lives become one as we turn our attention to God.

## Feast Day of Great Martyr Catherine of Alexandria

We commemorate St. Catherine on December 7. Martyred in the early 4<sup>th</sup> Century at the hand of Emperor Maxentius, Saint Catherine was born a princess and became a noted scholar. She became a Christian when she was 14 years old, and subsequently converted hundreds to Christianity. She was martyred at the young age of 18.

Father Bohdan's Sermon Sunday, November 29, 2020 Matthew 9:9-13

In today's Scripture reading, Jesus meets Matthew, the tax collector, for the first time. "Come be my disciple," Jesus says. And then Matthew, after acknowledging his sins, repaying anyone he had ever cheated, and giving his possessions to the poor, followed Christ. He became a disciple, apostle and evangelist. Today we celebrate his Feast Day. First, what is the difference between a disciple and apostle? A disciple is a follower and student of a mentor and teacher. An apostle accepts and delivers those teachings to others, spreading the word of God. And now, I want you to think about your role as a disciple of Christ. Can you be a disciple? Most definitely yes. But you may think that you are too imperfect to ever be worthy of being one of Jesus' disciples. The Scripture is replete with flawed people chosen by Jesus: Moses, Peter, David, the Samaritan Woman at the Well and Matthew to name a few. And as today's Scripture says: "God has not called the righteous but the

sinners to repentance."



On this day, Ukrainians all over the world light a symbolic candle of remembrance, honoring the victims of this tragedy. This photo is the haunting statue known as "Bitter Memory of Childhood" at the National Museum of the Holodomor-Genocide in Kyiv, Ukraine. The statue is a young girl clutching a handful of wheat and is dedicated to the most vulnerable victims of starvation: children.




