

How to Prepare for the Blessing of Your Home

A lighted candle, an icon or cross, and a bowl for Holy Water should be placed on a table covered with a clean tablecloth, preferably white. Turn OFF the radio, television and computer. All who are present in the house should come together and stand by the table where the service takes place. Finally, print the first names of the immediate family members on a sheet of paper for commemoration.

Sunday, February 12, is the Sunday of the Prodigal Son. We have heard this Scripture reading (Luke 15:11-32) of the father and his two sons many times. Focus on the joy that the father experienced when his wayward son finally returns home to receive a joyous welcome....a party....a celebration! The spiritual message is that if you have sinned and are truly repentant as the Prodigal Son was, you can return to God the Father and be accepted by Him with great joy no matter what you have done. And those who have not fallen should not resent those who come back. They should share in their Father's joy. Surely you have experienced such joy, both in forgiving others and being forgiven, the joy of reconciliation. The Prodigal Son rejoiced in receiving his father's blessing of forgiveness just as all Orthodox faithful rejoice in receiving blessings from God.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2023

SUNDAY OF THE PRODIGAL SON

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit. **PRIEST**: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 2nd Tone: The Lord is my strength and my song. He has become my salvation.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from Corinthians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...All things are lawful for me, but all things are not helpful. All things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any. Foods for the stomach and the stomach for foods, but God will destroy both it and them. Now the body is not for sexual immorality but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God both raised up the Lord and will also raise us up by His power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a harlot? Certainly not! Or do you not know that he who is joined to a harlot is one body with her? For "the two," He says, "shall become one flesh." But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him. Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's. (1 Corinthians 6:12-20)

'And he arose and came to his father. But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him. And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight, and am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his servants, 'Bring out the best robe and put it on him and put a ring on his hand and sandals on his feet. 'And bring the fatted calf here and kill it and let us eat and be merry; 'for this my son was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' And they began to be merry. Now his older son was in the field. And as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. So he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and because he has received him safe and sound, your father has killed the fatted calf.' But he was angry and would not go in. Therefore his father came out and pleaded with him. So he answered and said to his father, 'Lo, these many years I have been serving you; I never transgressed your commandment at any time; and yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might make merry with my friends. 
