


Sunday of the Prodigal Son

On this Sunday, the third Sunday before Lent, the Church teaches us God's compassion and forgiveness.



GREAT LENT

This year, Great Lent begins on Monday, March 7, 2022. We prepare for our Lenten journey on the five preceding Sundays:

- Sunday, February 6: Zacchaeus Sunday
- Sunday, February 13: Publican & Pharisee
- Sunday, February 20: Prodigal Son
- Sunday, February 27: Meatfare Sunday
- Sunday, March 6: Cheesefare/ Forgiveness Sunday

Each Sunday has a special commemoration named for the Gospel reading assigned to that day. This Sunday, the Gospel reading is the parable about the Prodigal Son.



This familiar parable tells the story of a rich farmer who had two sons, whom he intended to make his heirs. One day the younger son asked for his inheritance in advance, and his father gave it to him. The young man took his money, left his home and lived extravagantly, spending all he had. Poor and hungry, he returned home to ask forgiveness of his father.

And his father did just that, welcoming him home with great joy and a feast in his honor.

The elder, dutiful, hard-working son, however, was angry. His father explained, "Son, you are always with me, and all that I have is yours. It was right that we should make merry and be glad, for your brother was dead and is alive again, and was lost and is found."

Bishop Luke's Sermon – Sunday, February 13, 2022 Luke 18:10-14

Today is the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee and as we heard in the Scripture reading, two men -- the Pharisee and the Publican taxcollector -- went to the temple to pray. Two men and two lessons emerge from what happened next. First, we immediately see that the Pharisee is self-righteous, even though he is repenting. He says: I fast....I give to the church...I am good....I am not like other men. And then the Pharisee did not mind his own business! Not only did he think of himself as the best, he criticized the tax collector. I am better than the tax collector, he said. The Pharisee thought he knew what was in the mind and heart of the Publican. The lesson: Do not compare yourself to others. Do not compare notes. Do not compare who is worse, whose sins are greater than yours. Be like the Publican: truly repentant and humble, recognizing your own faults and then working to correct them. Remember the final sentence of today's Scripture reading: for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted. AMEN.

Metropolitan John Presents A Unique Icon To St. Nicholas Church

Originally created for ATO soldiers (anti-terrorist operations) in Kyiv, this unique, original icon was hand-carried by Metropolitan John from Kyiv to Philadelphia and St. Nicholas Church, now the icon's permanent home – in appreciation for the ongoing generous support of the Ukrainian chaplains. Chaplains hold a special place in St. Nicholas Church as both Father John Bohush and Father Bohdan serve as Chaplains.

The icon "Sacred Virgin" is the patron saint and the spiritual strength of the Ukrainian Chaplains and has been reproduced on prayer cards for the soldiers. Sacred Virgin was painted by the Ukrainian icon painter Yuri Nikitin. The artist portrayed the Mother of God holding an omophorion in her hands, covering and protecting soldiers of different eras amidst a field of poppies. The poppy is a universal symbol of remembrance for all those who fought and died in wars. That we received the Sacred Virgin icon at the time of Veterans Day is especially poignant.

How to Prepare for the Blessing of Your Home?

A lighted candle, an icon or cross, and a bowl for Holy Water should be placed on a table covered with a clean tablecloth, preferably white. Turn OFF the radio, television and computer. All who are present in the house should come together and stand by the table where the service takes place. Finally, print the first names of the immediate family members on a sheet of paper for commemoration.


Valentine's Day Designer Shoe Sale to benefit the Vicariate







THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 20, 2022 SUNDAY OF THE PRODIGAL SON

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 2nd Tone: The Lord is my strength and my song. He has become my salvation.

CHOIR: The Lord is my strength and my song. He has become my salvation.

READER: The Lord has chastened me sorely, but He has not given me over unto death. The Lord is my strength and my song.

CHOIR: He has become my salvation.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from Corinthians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...All things are lawful for me, but all things are not helpful. All things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any. Foods for the stomach and the stomach for foods, but God will destroy both it and them. Now the body is not for sexual immorality but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God both raised up the Lord and will also raise us up by His power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a harlot? Certainly not! Or do you not know that he who is joined to a harlot is one body with her? For "the two," He says, "shall become one flesh." But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him. Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's. (1 Corinthians 6:12-20)

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. Then He said: "A certain man had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the portion of goods that falls to me.' So he divided to them his livelihood. And not many days after, the younger son gathered all together, journeyed to a far country, and there wasted his possessions with prodigal living. But when he had spent all, there arose a severe famine in that land, and he began to be in want. Then he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country, and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. And he would gladly have filled his stomach with the pods that the swine ate, and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger! 'I will arise and go to my father, and will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you, and I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Make me like one of your hired servants, 'And he arose and came to his father. But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him. And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight, and am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his servants, 'Bring out the best robe and put it on him and put a ring on his hand and sandals on his feet. 'And bring the fatted calf here and kill it and let us eat and be merry; 'for this my son was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' And they began to be merry. Now his older son was in the field. And as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. So he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and because he has received him safe and sound, your father has killed the fatted calf.' But he was angry and would not go in. Therefore his father came out and pleaded with him. So he answered and said to his father, 'Lo, these many years I have been serving you; I never transgressed your commandment at any time; and yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might make merry with my friends. 'But as soon as this son of yours came, who has devoured your livelihood with harlots, you killed the fatted calf for him.' And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that I have is yours. 'It was right that we should make merry and be glad, for your brother was dead and is alive again, and was lost and is found.' " (Luke 15:11-32)
