

Father Bohdan reads every name – almost 400 -- from this book during Divine Liturgy and the Panikhida on Soul Saturday.

The Eastern Orthodox faithful believe that the state of the soul can be affected by love and prayers, and Soul Saturdays are set aside for general commemoration of the departed. The significance of "Saturday" is that Christ lay in the Tomb on a Saturday.



On the 40th day after the Nativity of our Lord, St. Simeon encountered Jesus in the Temple when He was presented – "offered" – to God. This Feast Day is called "The Meeting of the Lord" or the "Feast of the Presentation" and was celebrated this past Monday, February 15.

Monday, Lebruary 15: Another name for the Feast is "The Candles" because it is the custom to bless candles on this day. And Father Bohdan did just that – blessed our candles ~ on the Feast Day. He invites parishioners to take a blessed candle home. The lighted blessed candle should be placed before a Holy Icon when we pray to God for His Divine protection in times of distress and need.





Father Bohdan was asked why candles are blessed on this Feast Day. The answer: when St. Simeon took the Child Jesus into his arms, he was inspired by the Holy Spirit and chanted a hymn referring to Jesus as the "Light to the Gentiles." The hymn prompted the first Christians to carry a lighted candle in the procession that day, symbolizing the mystical presence of the "True Light" - Jesus.

Burning candles also creates a more prayerful feeling in church. They remind us that our prayers should come from a heart "burning" with love of God. Candles intensify our prayers; and the flame symbolizes the continuation of our prayers even if we are not physically in the church.



Father Bohdan's Sermon Sunday, February 14, 2021

John 19:1-10

Jesus chose to be the guest of this sinner! But even the sinner is not ALL bad! Zacchaeus told Jesus that half of all he had, he gave to the poor – and if he ever defrauded anyone, he restored it 4-fold.

Zacchaeus felt compelled to let Jesus know this perhaps because Jesus showed him compassion when others did not. Yes, by His actions, Jesus showed the crowd -- showed us -- God's grace, mercy and love.

We should ALL follow Jesus' example. Try to speak kindly to someone you do not like. Try to forgive someone who may have thought ill of you. Try not to judge others as the crowd judged Zaccheus. It's all about love. Chapter 4 of the Ephesians says: "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love."

SUNDAY OF THE PUBLICAN & PHARISEE

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 4th Tone: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made

them all!

CHOIR: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

READER: Bless the Lord, O my soul! O my God, Thou art very great! O Lord, how manifold are Thy works!

CHOIR: In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from Timothy.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...But you have carefully followed my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, love, perseverance, persecutions, afflictions, which happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra-what persecutions I endured. And out of them all the Lord delivered me. Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution. But evil men and impostors will grow worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived. But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned them, and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. (2 Timothy 3:10-15)

And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted. (Luke 18:10-14)


