4. Forgiveness Sunday or Cheesefare Sunday (Matthew 6:14-21).

Forgiveness Sunday brings the period of preparation to an end. The Vespers service served on the evening of Forgiveness Sunday includes the Rite of Mutual Forgiveness and is the first service of Great Lent.



How to Prepare for the Blessing of Your Home

A lighted candle, an icon or cross, and a bowl for Holy Water should be placed on a table covered with a clean tablecloth, preferably white. Turn OFF the radio, television and computer. All who are present in the house should come together and stand by the table where the service takes place. Finally, print the first names of the immediate family members on a sheet of paper for commemoration.



Sunday's Scripture reading - Luke 18: 10-14 -- is the Parable of the Publican and the Pharisee. Jesus told this parable to teach people that it is better to be humble than proud, and He chose two very different men to convey the message: a Pharisee -- someone who abided strictly by the rules of religious practice; and a Publican -- a tax collector, someone thought to be dishonest. The parable begins: "Two men went into the temple to pray....one was a Pharisee and the other a Publican." The Pharisee told God what a good man he was and that he was not like the Publican. The Publican, on the other hand, acknowledged his faults, was sorry for them and asked for mercy. Jesus used these two men to show us that strict adherence to religious rules like the Pharisee -- is still not enough to make a good man. And that even a Publican could be honest, good-hearted and just.


