Father Bohdan's Sermon Sunday, Jan. 31, 2021 Luke 18:18-27



In today's Scripture reading, we hear about the perils of money and the very familiar passage: IT IS EASIER FOR A CAMEL TO GO THROUGH THE EYE OF A NEEDLE THAN IT IS FOR A RICH MAN TO ENTER THE KINGDOM OF GOD.

Money is not evil, wealth is not evil. But money is a great responsibility – to manage it wisely. Think of all the millionaires, the billionaires in the world who have done enormous good with their money. Philanthropists who build hospitals, schools, give to the aid of the needy in the world. And they do this with joy and a pure heart.

But for every generous person, there is a hard-hearted, stingy miser. A rich person who uses his money for drugs or for gambling. The rich man obsessed with his assets, burdened with his accumulations and possessions that he is blind to his spiritual poverty. Perhaps this is the rich man Jesus refers to in today's Scripture reading. The one who does not act responsibly with his wealth. There is nothing wrong with being wealthy. There is nothing wrong with money. There is nothing wrong with even praying for good fortune. Money sustains our lives, our houses and our church, too. It is important to know that anyone can earn eternal life, rich or poor or in between. But if you are blessed with wealth – and that wealth may be a \$100 bonus from your employer – or a \$1 bill you find on the street – use it wisely, spend it responsibly – and for the glory of God. AMEN.




