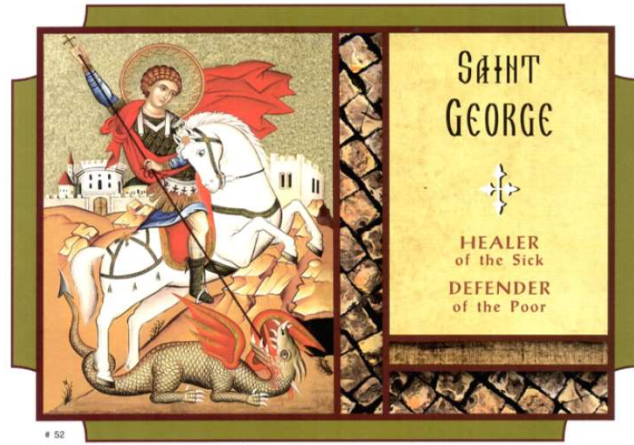

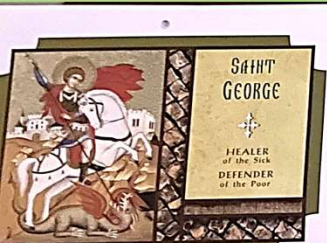

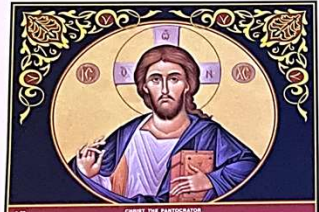

Thank you to Vicki Borriello and all those who contributed their favorite traditional dishes for Holy Supper, attended by 40 people. In the center of the table stood a beautiful icon of the Nativity of Jesus Christ.



Holy Supper began with the lighting of a single, tall candle, placed in the center of a loaf of lenten bread, which represents Christ as the light of the world. The tablecloths were white, symbolizing Jesus' swaddling clothes.

During a Litany on Christmas Eve, Bishop Luke blessed 5 loaves of bread while intoning the following prayer:

“O Lord Jesus Christ our God, who did bless the 5 loaves and did feed the 5,000, do Thou, the same Lord, bless these loaves, wheat, wine and oil and multiply them in this holy habitation and in all Thy world; and sanctify all the faithful who shall partake of them. For it is Thou, O Christ our God, who does bless and sanctify all things and unto Thee we ascribe glory with the Father who has no beginning and Thine All-Holy, Good and life-creating Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.”

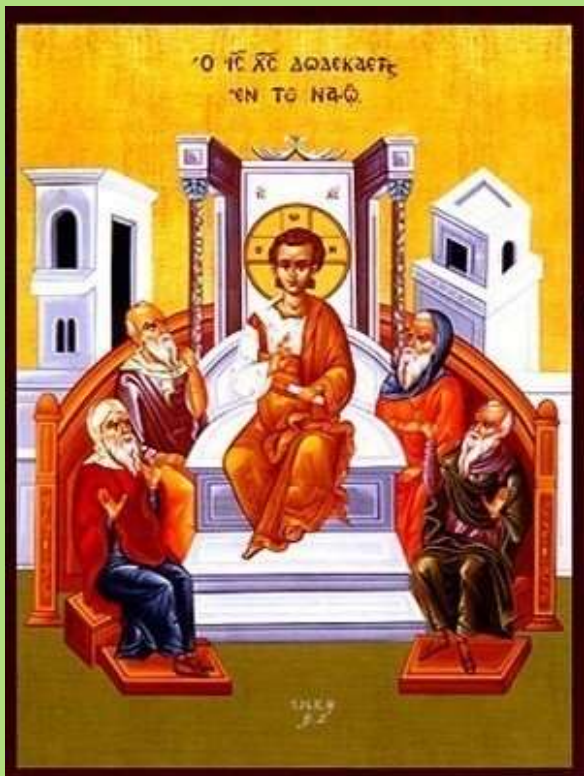

Scripture Reading & Sermon

Sunday, January 14, 2024

Luke 2:20-21; 40-52



Icon: Jesus, 12 years old, in the Temple

Do you remember the first word your child spoke? Was it Mama? Or Dada? How you anxiously awaited the sound of your baby's voice, curious what the first word would be! In today's Scripture reading, we hear the first words Jesus spoke – or at least recorded in the Bible. He was 12 years old at the time.

After frantically searching the city of Jerusalem for Jesus because He was missing for three days, Mary and Joseph finally found their son in the Temple. Jesus was surprised by their anxiety and concern, and said: ***"Did you not know that I would be in My Father's house?"*** These were His first words.

But let's focus on the anguish of His parents. Simply put, they lost Jesus. Mary and Joseph had searched desperately for Him all over the city for three days. What would they tell God? God entrusted Mary and Joseph with His only Son, and they lost Him! You can just imagine their anxiety and – then the relief after finding Jesus in the Temple. Jesus was the divine son of God, but also the son of man. After being found, He obeyed His earthly parents and left the Temple.

How could you lose what is important to you? It is easier than you think. My message to you today is this: When you find Jesus -- or someone you love with all of your heart -- hold them precious and dear. Cling to them. Never lose the best thing in your life...the one who fills your heart. Never lose Jesus once you have found Him. AMEN.

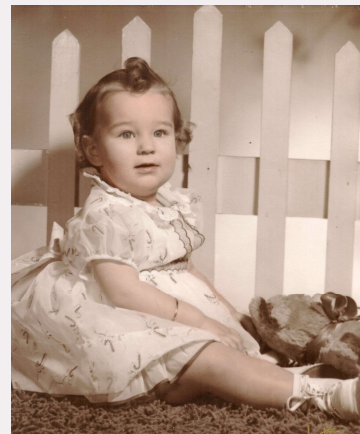

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JANUARY 14, 2024

32ND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 7th Tone: The Lord shall give strength to His people! The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

CHOIR: The Lord shall give strength to His people! The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

READER: Offer to the Lord, O ye sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord! The Lord shall give strength to His people!

CHOIR: The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Colossians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Beware lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and empty deceit, according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ. For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power. In Him you were also circumcised with the circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the sins of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, buried with Him in baptism, in which you also were raised with Him through faith in the working of God, who raised Him from the dead. **(Col. 2:8-12)**

PRIEST: Peace be unto thee, Reader.

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! **CHOIR:** Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

READER: It is good to give thanks unto the Lord, to sing praises to Thy Name, O Most High!
To declare Thy mercy in the morning and Thy truth by night!

CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

PRIEST: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told them. And when eight days were completed for the circumcision of the Child, His name was called JESUS, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb. And the Child grew and became strong in spirit, filled with wisdom; and the grace of God was upon Him. His parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. And when He was twelve years old, they went up to Jerusalem according to the custom of the feast. When they had finished the days, as they returned, the Boy Jesus lingered behind in Jerusalem. And Joseph and His mother did not know it; but supposing Him to have been in the company, they went a day's journey, and sought Him among their relatives and acquaintances. So when they did not find Him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking Him. Now so it was that after three days they found Him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard Him were astonished at His understanding and answers. So when they saw Him, they were amazed; and His mother said to Him, "Son, why have You done this to us? Look, Your father and I have sought You anxiously." And He said to them, "Why did you seek Me? Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business?"
