

On Sunday, January 24, 2021, the Orthodox Church venerates St. Theodosius the Great. This is a photo of the "Monastery of Saint Theodosius" founded by the Saint in 476 located in the Palestine territory near Bethlehem. In the courtyard of the monastery, there is an entrance to a small cave, Theodosius' retreat. This is the place where the Three Magi took shelter the first night after paying homage to the newborn Baby Jesus. It is also the place where St. Theodosius' remains are buried. The Monastery of Saint Theodosius was repeatedly destroyed and rebuilt. The building standing today was completed in 1952.





Turn OFF the radio, television and computer. All who are present in the house should come together and stand by the table where the service takes place. Print the first names of the immediate family members on a sheet of paper for commemoration.



33RD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 8th Tone: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

CHOIR: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

READER: In Judah God is known. His Name is great in Israel! Pray and make your vows.

CHOIR: Before the Lord our God!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Ephesians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore He says: "When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men. (Now this, "He ascended"-what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ. **(Ephesians 4:7-13)**




