

Following the 40 days of Nativity
Lent, the birth of Jesus Christ is
commemorated with a final Lenten feast
on Christmas Eve, this year on Friday,
January 6, 2023.

The Holy Supper table is replete with symbolism: from placing hay under the table and tablecloth in memory of the manger in which the Holy Child was placed by His Mother at His birth, to the white linen tablecloth which represents Jesus' swaddling birth clothes.

Holy Supper consists of 12 courses, symbolic of the 12 Apostles. The foods range from bitter to sweet to remind us of the bitterness of life before Christ was born and the sweetness of life which comes after His birth.

Holy Supper begins with the singing of the Christmas

Troparion and the lighting of a candle placed in the center of the table. The candle symbolizes the star of Bethlehem.

Bishop Luke will then lead us in prayer which includes reading the Nativity account from the Gospel of St. Matthew 2:1-12. He will ask God in the opening prayer to bless the bread, wine, and food. He then breaks the bread and passes it out to all present. This symbolizes Christ at the Last Supper. At the conclusion of the meal, it is traditional for all to attend Vespers, following which the Patriarchal Choir sings Christmas Carols.



The Scripture Reading for Sunday, January 8, 2023 - Matthew 2:13-23

Today's Scripture reading gives an account of Jesus' birth but as seen through the eyes of King Herod, a jealous, ruthless king, a murdering king. Herod was deeply disturbed when he learned that a child had been born who was being called "King of the Jews." He was threatened and paranoid -- even though Jesus was a baby and he was an old man. Herod is the dark side of Christmas. And we can relate his cruelty to our own dark feelings. Christmas is not only about "good tidings of great joy." At the time of Jesus' birth - then and now -- there is sorrow and pain. Perhaps you were not merry and jolly this Christmas, thinking about the problems in the world. But the miracle of the Nativity is that Jesus brings hope and peace when we are overcome with sorrow and despair. Trust the new King Who was born – Jesus Christ – He Who will conquer death; heal our hurts; deliver us from our sin; and relieve our despair. No matter what the New Year 2023 brings, know that you can meet any challenges and obstacles ahead with the hope that Jesus makes available to you!

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JANUARY 8, 2023

30TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit. **PRIEST:** Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 5th Tone:

Thou, O Lord, shall protect us and preserve us from this generation forever.

CHOIR: Thou, O Lord, shall protect us and preserve us from this generation forever!

READER: Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer any that is godly. Thou, O Lord, shall protect us.

CHOIR: And preserve us from this generation forever.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Hebrews.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Both the one who makes people holy and those who are made holy are of the same family. So Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters. He says, "I will declare your name to my brothers and sisters; in the assembly I will sing your praises." And again, "I will put my trust in him." And again he says, "Here am I, and the children God has given me." Since the children have flesh and blood, He too shared in their humanity so that by His death He might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil — and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. For surely it is not angels He helps, but Abraham's descendants. For this reason He had to be made like them, fully human in every way, in order that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that He might make atonement for the sins of the people. Because He Himself suffered when He was tempted, He is able to help those who are being tempted. (**Hebrews 2:11-18**)


