The Feast Day of Holy Apostles Peter and Paul

The Apostles' Fast began on June 15 and ends on the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul on Sunday, July 12. The Feast Day recognizes the martyrdom of the two saints sometime between AD 64 and 68 in Rome. Saints Peter and Paul were two very different men of different backgrounds and education (a fisherman and a Pharisee) who came to Christ through two extremely different paths and at two very different times. But they both became disciples of Christ and allowed Him to transform their lives. And they, in turn,

SAINT LONGINUS THE CENTURION

Father Bohdan's Sermon – Sunday, July 5, 2020 Matthew 8:5-13

In today's Gospel reading, we meet the Centurion. He told Jesus that when he – the Centurion – gave an order – whether to a soldier, or his servant, or to anyone – they followed his order. There was no doubt in his mind. And so the Centurion knew – he never questioned for a moment – that if Jesus said his servant would be healed – without ever seeing the servant – he would be healed. Even Jesus was amazed by such pure absolute faith!

It starts within....this faith....within your own world. For if your employees or friends or children don't listen to you, you begin to doubt that anyone follow orders. How many times have you been let down when someone did not follow through on your instructions? Did the handyman show up on time when he promised to do so? Were your friends late for an important event when you give them a specific arrival time? Did you beg your children to be ready for church in the morning and they disregarded you? Did you ever give a colleague an assignment, trusted them to follow through and complete it - and they did not? We have learned NOT to expect someone to keep their word or listen to us. So, it is far more difficult in today's world to have the absolute faith that the Centurion had. You probably ask: how can I trust someone I cannot see (Jesus) if I cannot trust someone I do see? But we can. Our Gospel reading today reminds us to keep true to ourselves and believe in the integrity of others. If you can renew your faith in others, you can definitely have faith in Jesus. Jesus is perfect. He does not have the same flaws that we have. Be like the Centurion and trust Jesus to follow through on the assignment! Jesus will not let you down! AMFN.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JULY 12

5TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST -THE HOLY APOSTLES PETER AND PAUL

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 4th Tone: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

CHOIR: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

READER: Bless the Lord, O my soul! O my God, Thou art very great! O Lord, how manifold are Thy works!

CHOIR: In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Corinthians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...To our shame I say that we were too weak for that! But in whatever anyone is bold-I speak foolishly-I am bold also. Are they Hebrews? So am I. Are they Israelites? So am I. Are they the seed of Abraham? So am I. Are they ministers of Christ?-I speak as a fool-I am more: in labors more abundant, in stripes above measure, in prisons more frequently, in deaths often. From the Jews five times I received forty stripes minus one. Three times I was beaten with rods; once I was stoned; three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I have been in the deep; in journeys often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils of my own countrymen, in perils of the Gentiles, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren; in weariness and toil, in sleeplessness often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness-besides the other things, what comes upon me daily: my deep concern for all the churches. Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is made to stumble, and I do not burn with indignation? If I must boast, I will boast in the things which concern my infirmity. The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying. In Damascus the governor, under Aretas the king, was guarding the city of the Damascenes with a garrison, desiring to arrest me; but I was let down in a basket through a window in the wall, and escaped from his hands. It is doubtless not profitable for me to boast, I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord: I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago-whether in the body I do not know, or whether out of the body I do not know, God knows-such a one was caught up to the third heaven. And I know such a man-whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows- how he was caught up into Paradise and heard inexpressible words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter. Of such a one I will boast; yet of myself I will not boast, except in my infirmities. For though I might desire to boast, I will not be a fool; for I will speak the truth. But I refrain, lest anyone should think of me above what he sees me to be or hears from me. And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure. Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

(2 Corinthians 11:21-12:9)
