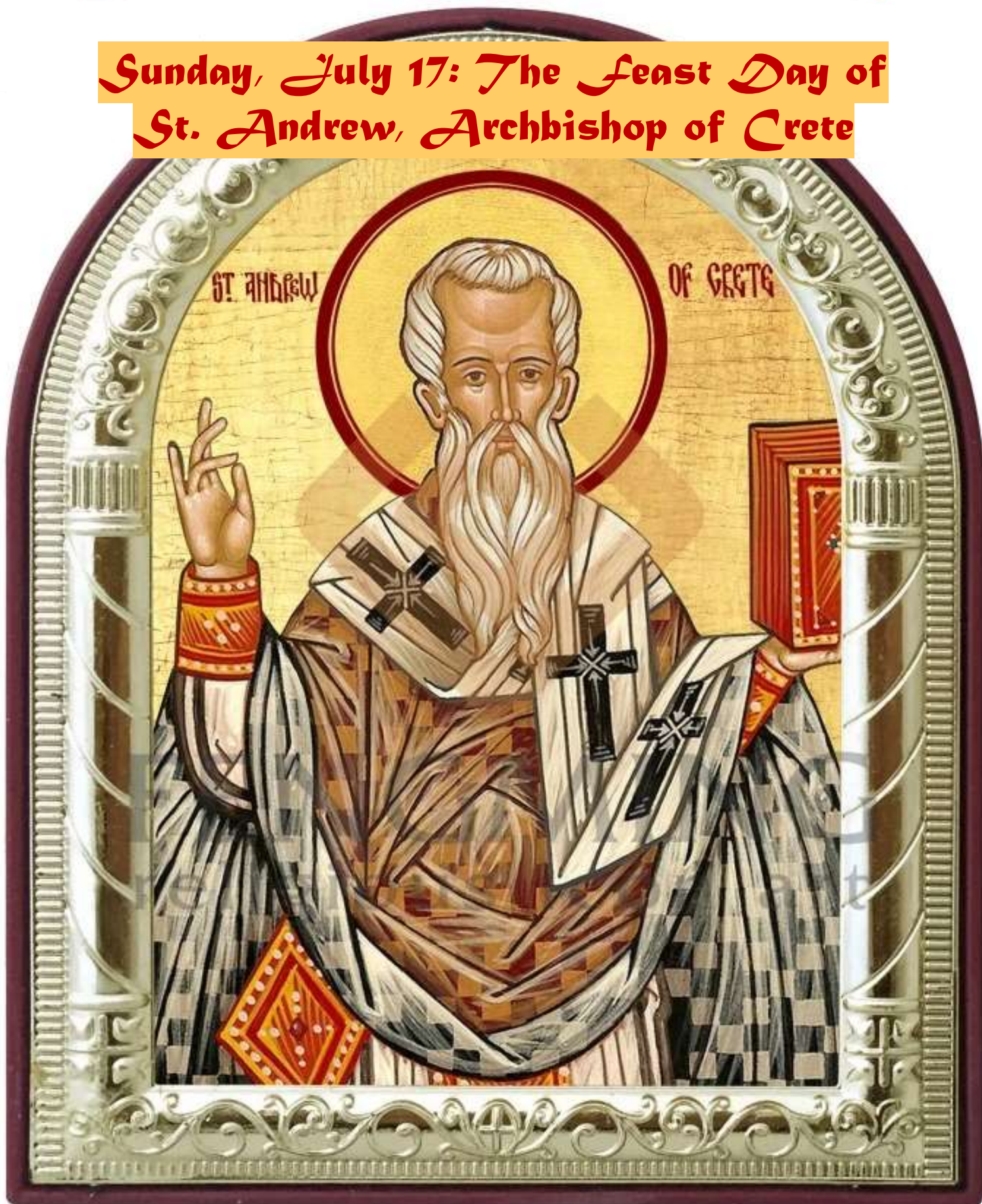

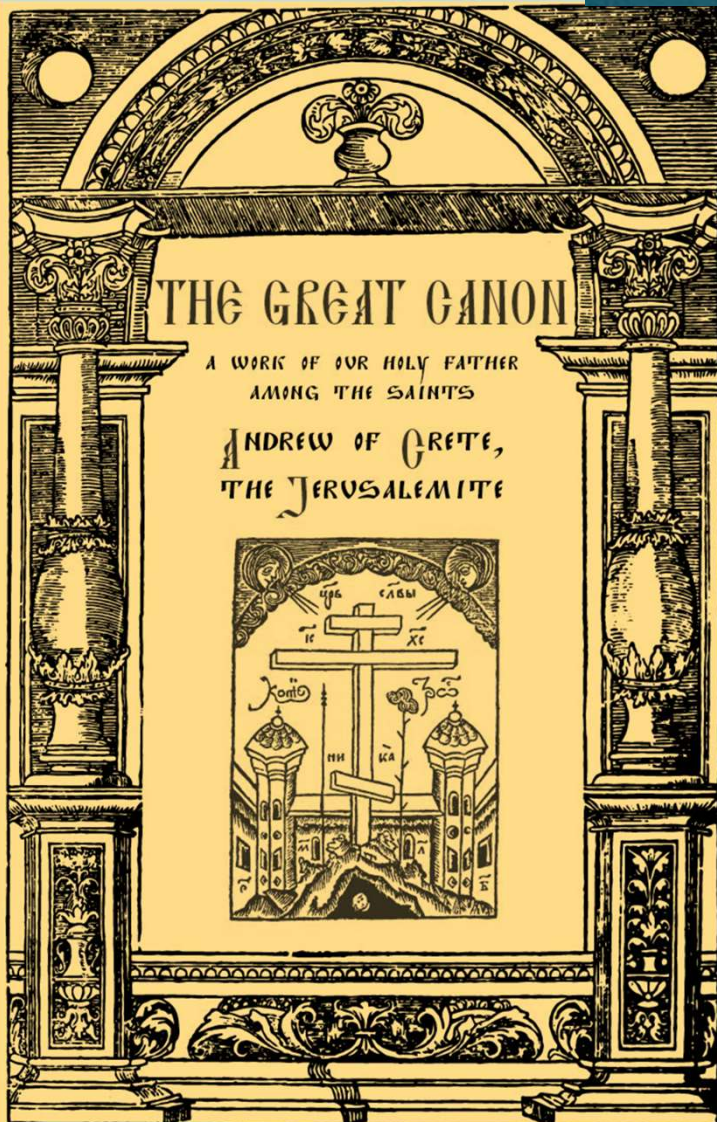

Among his many talents and accomplishments, St. Andrew composed the monumental *“The Great Canon of Repentance.”* *The Great Canon* is sung in parts Monday-Thursday during the first week of Great Lent and again, in its entirety (which takes approximately 4 hours to sing), on the Thursday of the fifth week. *The Great Canon* is described as a “dialogue between St. Andrew and his soul,” a hymn of profound contrition and heart-rending repentance. It is also the longest canon (with 250 Troparia) in all of the Orthodox services.

In today's Bible reading, we meet the Centurion. He told Jesus that when he - the Centurion -- gave an order - whether to a soldier, or his servant, or to anyone - they followed his order. There was no doubt in his mind. And so the Centurion knew - he never questioned for a moment - that if Jesus said His servant would be healed - without ever seeing the servant - he would be healed. Even Jesus was amazed by such pure absolute faith! It starts within....this faith....within your own world. For if your employees or friends or children don't listen to you, you begin to doubt that anyone follow orders. You probably ask: **HOW CAN I TRUST SOMEONE I CANNOT SEE (JESUS) IF I CANNOT TRUST SOMEONE I DO SEE?** But we can. Our Bible reading today reminds us to keep true to ourselves and believe in the integrity of others. If you can renew your faith in others, you can definitely have faith in Jesus. Jesus is perfect. He does not have the same flaws that we have. **BE LIKE THE CENTURION AND TRUST JESUS to follow through on the assignment! JESUS WILL NOT LET YOU DOWN! AMEN.**

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JULY 17, 2022

5TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 4th Tone: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

CHOIR: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

READER: Bless the Lord, O my soul! O my God Thou are very great! O Lord, how manifold are Thy works!

CHOIR: In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Romans.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be saved. For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted to the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. For Moses writes about the righteousness which is of the law, "The man who does those things shall live by them." But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down from above) or "'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. **(Romans 10:1-10)**

PRIEST: Peace be unto thee, Reader.

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! **CHOIR:** Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

READER: Go forth, prosper and reign because of truth and meekness and righteousness.
You love righteousness and hate iniquity.

CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

PRIEST: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. When He had come to the other side, to the country of the Gergesenes, there met Him two demon-possessed men, coming out of the tombs, exceedingly fierce, so that no one could pass that way. And suddenly they cried out, saying, "What have we to do with You, Jesus, You Son of God? Have You come here to torment us before the time?" Now a good way off from them there was a herd of many swine feeding. So the demons begged Him, saying, "If You cast us out, permit us to go away into the herd of swine." And He said to them, "Go." So when they had come out, they went into the herd of swine. And suddenly the whole herd of swine ran violently down the steep place into the sea, and perished in the water. Then those who kept them fled; and they went away into the city and told everything, including what had happened to the demon-possessed men. And behold, the whole city came out to meet Jesus. And when they saw Him, they begged Him to depart from their region. So He got into a boat, crossed over, and came to His own city. **(Matthew 8:28-9:1)**
