

Newly-Discovered Morks by Young "Iconographers"









A creative St. Nicholas Church Sunday School project almost 30 years ago instilled an important understanding of Orthodox iconography in young St. Nicholas Church students.

DO YOU KNOW THE MEANING OF THE VARIOUS OBJECTS HELD BY SAINTS IN A PORTRAIT ICON?

A CROSS indicates that the Saint is a Holy Martyr; a **\$CROLL** means holy wisdom and is often shown in the hands of the holy Apostles; sainted Bishops hold the soldier-BOOK: GOSPEL who converted martvr Christianity holds a **WEAPON** (a sword, shield, lance or pike); and a small CHURCH BUILDING is held by those saints who are "pillars of recognized as the church." like Saint Peter Saint Paul.



Father Bohdan's Sermon – Sunday, July 12 Matthew 16:13-19

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus says to Peter: "On this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it." In other words, no matter what catastrophes our Church may encounter, Jesus reassures us that the Church will survive -- and thrive. And in this present day, could we interpret Hades to mean something so terrible that our congregation is forced to stay away from St. Nicholas Church? Could Hades mean something like the coronavirus? If you believe that, then this Scripture passage - "on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it" should give you comfort, strength, encouragement - and faith - that one day we will not wear masks, one day we can embrace each other again and one day our sanctuary will be full. Do not despair! Can you worship God anywhere? Absolutely. But if you are not a vital part of the church, then your spiritual life will waste away. If you are not serving and worshipping in a church family, you will experience a void, an emptiness. When we gather together in person, working together, believing together, praying together, we can do so much more as a group than as an individual. When we take your energy, and your time, and your talent, and your faith - and put them all together - we can accomplish anything. That is why church as a physical building in which we can gather is essential. Today's Gospel reading affirms that. AMEN.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JULY 19

6TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 5th Tone: Thou, O Lord, shall protect us and preserve us from this generation forever!

CHOIR: Thou, O Lord, shall protect us and preserve us from this generation forever!

READER: Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer any that is Godly. Thou, O Lord, shall protect us.

CHOIR: And preserve us from this generation forever!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Romans.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer; distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse.

(Romans 12:6-14)
