"Lord, have mercy on us."

In Sunday's Scripture reading – Matthew 9:27-35

-- two blind men exclaimed, "Have mercy on us, Son of David," a variant of the well-known Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on us." Not only did Jesus give sight to these two blind men, He enabled a mute man to speak and He cast out demons! The multitudes were amazed at Jesus' power. The selfimportant and resentful Pharisees thought the opposite. In their eyes, Jesus could do nothing right. Matthew writes in Verse 34 that the Pharisees said the only reason Jesus could cast out the demons was because he was Satan himself! Let this verse be a reminder that to the arrogant and self-righteous, proof of your good works does not matter. The Pharisees questioned, debated, and ridiculed Jesus even though they saw people being healed and lives changed right in front of them. Their scorn and disbelief were based not on insufficient evidence but on their jealousy of Jesus. Yet, as we know, their resentment did not stop Jesus from performing miracles. And so it should be with us. If your heart is pure and your intentions are good, let nothing stop you from doing good works for the glory of God.

Say the Jesus Prayer frequently and humbly, with love, a purity of heart and mind and a fervent desire to be close to God.

TWO UKRAINIAN SOLDIERS VISIT ST. NICHOLAS CATHEDRAL

On Sunday, July 16, 2023, the clergy and congregation of St. Nicholas Cathedral were honored by the presence of two Ukrainian soldiers who attended Divine Liturgy, prayed and worshipped with us. The two men, severely wounded in the war in Ukraine, were in the United States to receive prosthetics made possible by Kind Deeds (KindDeeds.org), a non-profit organization run by volunteers. Kind Deeds facilitates treatment in Ukraine and later transfer patients to the USA to receive prostheses and rehabilitation, entirely free of cost. Kind Deeds currently has a waiting list of over 200 Ukrainian soldiers urgently in need of their services.




