SUNDAY SERMON

Continuing with his visits to other UOC-KP parishes, Vicar Bishop Luke will be celebrating Hierarchal Divine Liturgy in Davie, Florida on Sunday, July 24. The Scripture reading for July 24 is Matthew 9:1-8. This is Bishop Luke's Sermon:

Jesus performed a great many miracles: He healed the sick. He cast out demons. He calmed stormy seas. In today's Scripture reading, Jesus heals a paralyzed man, commanding him to walk. He said: YOUR SINS ARE FORGIVEN. ARISE, TAKE UP YOUR BED AND GO TO YOUR HOUSE. The crowd was filled with awe by Jesus' power. They glorified God and believed. The Scribes, however, condemned Jesus. Their thoughts were: THIS MAN BLASPHEMES! This was one of many confrontations between Jesus and the Scribes whose job was to know and preserve God's word. But ironically, adhering to the letter of the law -- as the Scribes did -- conflicted with what Jesus taught and God actually wanted. In another passage of Matthew, Chapter 5:20, Jesus says: the righteousness of the Scribes is not enough to get anyone to heaven. God knows that we are fallible human beings on a long road of missteps, negative thoughts, imperfect behavior. But if your heart is pure and you constantly try to change for the better, God promises forgiveness, peace and salvation. AMEN.

On Saturday, July 16, 2022, with the blessing of His Holiness Patriarch Philaret, Bishop Luke met with Bishop Jaroslav (Jerry) Rafalko, Bishop of the Western Diocese of the Polish National Catholic Church. The two Bishops met at All Saints Cathedral in Chicago and began an ecumenical dialogue on such pressing issues as the continued support of the Ukrainian people during the war (the Polish clergy and community raised approximately \$80,000 and also purchased an ambulance which was delivered to Ukraine); church development; spiritual education and the possible establishment of a seminary; and the development of inter-religious relations in our contemporary world.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JULY 24, 2022

6TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 5th Tone: Thou, O Lord, shall protect us and preserve us from this generation forever!

CHOIR: Thou, O Lord, shall protect us and preserve us from this generation forever!

READER: Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer any that is Godly. Thou, O Lord, shall protect us.

CHOIR: And preserve us from this generation forever!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Romans.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer; distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. **(Romans 12:6-14)**

But Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said, "Why do you think evil in your hearts? For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven you,' or to say, 'Arise and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of Man has power on earth to forgive sins-then He said to the paralytic, "Arise, take up your bed, and go to your house." And he arose and departed to his house.
