JULY 28, 2021: THE FEAST DAY OF THE HOLY EQUAL-TO-THE-APOSTLES GREAT PRINCE VLADIMIR (c. 958-1015)




Born a pagan prince, Saint Vladimir's personal spiritual awakening eventually transformed an entire nation to Christianity with the mass Baptism of the Kyivans in the waters of the Dnieper River. Prince Vladimir subsequently demolished all pagan monuments and built monasteries and churches, starting with the Church of the Tithes, the first stone church in Kyiv. St. Volodymyr Cathedral in Kyiv is dedicated to Great Prince Vladimir.

This distinguished title -- Holy Equal-To-The-Apostles -- is bestowed as a recognition of various saints' outstanding service in the spreading and assertion of Christianity, comparable to that of the original apostles. That Prince Vladimir was elevated from paganism to the heights of sanctity is a testament to Christ's ability to convert sinners into saints.



If the painting on the cover of this Bulletin looks familiar, it is because a replica is hanging in the Sanctuary on the back wall of the Choir Loft. This is a photo of the Sanctuary taken in 1945 when the church was rededicated a huge celebration that included the Mayor of Philadelphia at that time. the Hon. Bernard Samuel, the last Republicanelected Mayor of Philadelphia who held office from 1941-1952.

2021 marks the 1033rd anniversary of the Baptism of Kyivan-Rus-Ukraine. Three years ago, Father Bohdan led a group of parishioners, including the Church Council, on a historic pilgrimage to Kyiv, where they participated with more than 100,000 Orthodox faithful in the 1030th anniversary celebration of the Baptism of Kyivan-Rus-Ukraine.

Deteriorated and damaged by dampness, mold and mildew, the framed commemoration (written in old Slavonic) was recently restored and will be hung in our entrance foyer.

Our History

Approximately 680 parishioners and friends of St. Nicholas Church donated money for the 1945 restoration. Tradition was to list the amount of each contribution, and you will see that donations ranged from \$1 to \$200.



Prior to the 1945 Rededication, a lot of work was accomplished in the Sanctuary and Rectory: many icons were painted and restored by iconographer George Novikoff; the faux marble, created by church parishioner Simeon Filipovich Frederick, was refurbished; the east wall was reconstructed; a new ambo built; the front steps were redone with white stone; new railings installed; and the rectory remodeled. All this is to say that renovation projects are part of our

past...present...and future!

CONVERTING **OUR CANDLESTANDS TO** SAND CANDLESTANDS PRACTICALITY AND TRADITION

Our brass candlestands are showing neglect and their age: they are covered with wax drippings; many are wobbly; and the No one has the time to small holders are missing. painstakingly remove the hardened wax that drips from burning candles, only to have the stands covered in candle wax again the very next week.

Converting the stands to sand candlestands makes sense. Upkeep is reduced to a quick regular polish of the brass. Melted wax is easily picked out of the sand and discarded. In addition, all sizes of candles can easily be placed in the sand.

Months ago, we experimented with converting one candlestand to sand -- the stand in front of the St. Nicholas icon. The domed top was removed; a cylinder prototype was fitted from the bottom of the vessel to the center ornamentation; and then the vessel - the bowl - was filled with sand. This popular stand was immediately filled with candles of all sizes.

So, the project moved forward this month. Over the next several weeks, each of our 11 stands will be taken to the church hall to be polished. The makeshift cylinder will be replaced with a custom-fitted, lacquered, fluted solid brass cylinder; the vessel filled with sand; and the stand returned to the Sanctuary. When the weather becomes cooler, the original domed tops will be cleaned of wax, polished and stored in our Sanctuary closet.

Sand candlestands have a long history in the Orthodox church. One custom is to draw a small sign of the Cross in the sand with the candle, then place the candle in the middle of the Cross. Light the candle. Quietly say a prayer. Make the sign of the Cross. Venerate the icon.

Father Bohdan works 24/7. And his relentless prayers and efforts get results...

Recently, Father was summoned to Maimonides Medical Center in Brooklyn, NY, by the medical team of his long-time friend, Bakhtier. Father Bohdan drove to Brooklyn many times as his friend's health deteriorated. The doctors advised that critical medical decisions — that only a family member could make -- were needed. Bakthier's only family, a brother, lives in Tajikistan with no hope of getting an exit visa. He told Father Bohdan that every day people queued in an endless line outside the U.S. Embassy in Dushanbe hoping for a miracle and the granting of a visa to the USA.

Please, could Father Bohdan help once again, the brother begged. Father immediately called the U.S. Embassy in Dushanbe – and then sent the following letter:

Dear Sir/Madam:

I am Very Reverend Father Bohdan Zhoba, Rector of St. Nicholas Orthodox Cathedral in Philadelphia, spiritual father, priest and long-time friend of Mr. Bakhtier Jalolov, who is a patient at Maimonides Medical Center in Brooklyn, NY and currently on life support.

I have visited Mr. Jalolov several times at Maimonides Medical Center and have spoken to his doctors. I can attest that the presence of family is critical at this time in order to make medical decisions for Mr. Jalolov. Mr. Jalolov is alone is the USA and has no family here to help him.

Given the dire circumstances, I implore you to please grant Mr. Jalolov's brother -- Mr. Rakhmatullo Zhalolov -- a temporary visa to visit his brother immediately.

Thank you for your efforts to accomplish this urgent request. The family and I are forever grateful for your assistance.

In response to Father's letter, Rakhmatullo was then contacted by the U.S. Embassy and granted a visa to enter the USA!

Father Bohdan's Sermon – Sunday, July 18, 2021 Matthew 8:5-13





In today's Bible reading, we meet the Centurion.

He told Jesus that when he – the Centurion -- gave an order – whether to a soldier, or his servant, or to anyone – they followed his order. There was no doubt in his mind. And so the Centurion knew – he never questioned for a moment – that if Jesus said his servant would be healed – without ever seeing the servant – he would be healed. Even Jesus was amazed by such pure absolute faith! It starts within.....this faith....within your own world. For if your employees or friends or children don't listen to you, you begin to doubt that anyone follow orders.

You probably ask: how can I trust someone I cannot see (Jesus) if I cannot trust someone I do see? But we can. Our Bible reading today reminds us to keep true to ourselves and believe in the integrity of others. If you can renew your faith in others, you can definitely have faith in Jesus. Jesus is perfect. He does not have the same flaws that we have. Be like the Centurion and trust Jesus to follow through on the assignment! Jesus will not let you down! AMEN.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JULY 25, 2021

5TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 4th Tone: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

CHOIR: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

READER: Bless the Lord, O my soul! O my God Thou are very great! O Lord, how manifold are Thy works!

CHOIR: In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

READER: The reading is from the Romans.

READER: Brothers...Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be saved. For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted to the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. For Moses writes about the righteousness which is of the law, "The man who does those things shall live by them." But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?' " (that is, to bring Christ down from above) or " 'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. **(Romans 10:1-10)**





