



3n 2004, the St. Nicholas

Congregation dug deep into its pockets to give donations for the purchase of our upholstered, wood church chairs in the Sanctuary. Within a few days of announcing the "Church Chair" project, we had collected \$16,266.00 from parishioners, the full cost of the 120 chairs. Then there was a debate among the Church Council members at that time concerning whether or not to mount a small brass plaque on the back of each chair (or row of chairs) with the inscription "Donated By...." or "In Memory of....". The final decision was an emphatic NO.

How nice it would have been to sit in the pews, see a name in front of you, remember the person, say a prayer. A missed opportunity to preserve history and commemorate our parishioners -- because it is only the generosity of parishioners that has sustained St. Nicholas Orthodox Cathedral — literally kept its doors open and the church thriving -- for 104 years.

But Father Bohdan has a very strong opinion about commemorative plaques: **everything should have a plaque**for history....for remembrance....for prayer. His wish is that every icon has a plaque on the back with information: when the church acquired it and who gifted it.




Clearly this is not a new concept. Look around the furnishings in the church; look at the icons on the iconostas; the candle stands; the stained glass windows; the framed acknowledgements in the vestibule – and most recently, the antique church chair that Ellen Hanavin donated. You will see the names of donors: current and former parishioners.


- The Amish sheds and the interior electrical work. You will be recognized on a plaque installed on the shed's exterior.

Father Bohdan's words did not fall on deaf ears. Our own long-time parishioner, **ALEX JANOCZKIN**, realized that raising close to \$2 million in two months was a long-shot. So he sprang into action! Alex contacted the drug company that makes the "orphan drug" (a drug developed to treat rare diseases) for SMA. After numerous phone calls with Novartis, Alex connected Pavlo's doctors with Novartis to discuss treatment and financial support for Pavlo. Alex then went one step further: he contacted his local Congressman Smith who suggested that Pavlo may be eligible for a clinical trial at Johns Hopkins of nusinersen, a drug for Pavlo's condition, manufactured by Biogen. Each injection of nusinersen costs \$125,000. And now **YOU** can help: by giving a monetary donation (see info below) -- and by calling or emailing Congressman Smith's office to plead for his assistance with the U.S. Embassy -- to grant a Humanitarian Visa to little Pavlo to enter the U.S. for treatment.





Sunday Sermon

Father Bohdan's Sermon - Sunday, June 27, 2021 Matthew 10:32-33: 37-38: 19:27-30

Today's Bible reading is short – and its message is very clear: WHAT IS YOUR REWARD FOR FOLLOWING CHRIST? The answer is: ETERNAL LIFE. Eternity in God's presence. Eternity in God's family.

Today we commemorate all the extraordinary saints who gave up everything to follow Jesus. They gave up their families, jobs and possessions to follow Christ and preach HIS teachings, with the promise of eternal life. Must YOU give up everything? All the Church asks of you is to give up your time to follow Christ – just 1 hour on a Sunday morning! And then devote time to doing good work in the Church.

As you know, there is no end to the work that is needed in the Church. I know there are faithful, dedicated people in our church family who organize, cook, comfort, teach, pray, preach, clean, sing and more. The work is just waiting for true followers of Christ to step up and say "HERE I AM, LORD. PUT ME TO WORK. I AM NOT HERE FOR A FREE RIDE." Can we then call you a SAINT for doing such work for the Church? NO. Only God will judge you. That what is meant by the words in today's Scripture reading: Many who are first will be last, and many who are last will be first. AMEN.
