

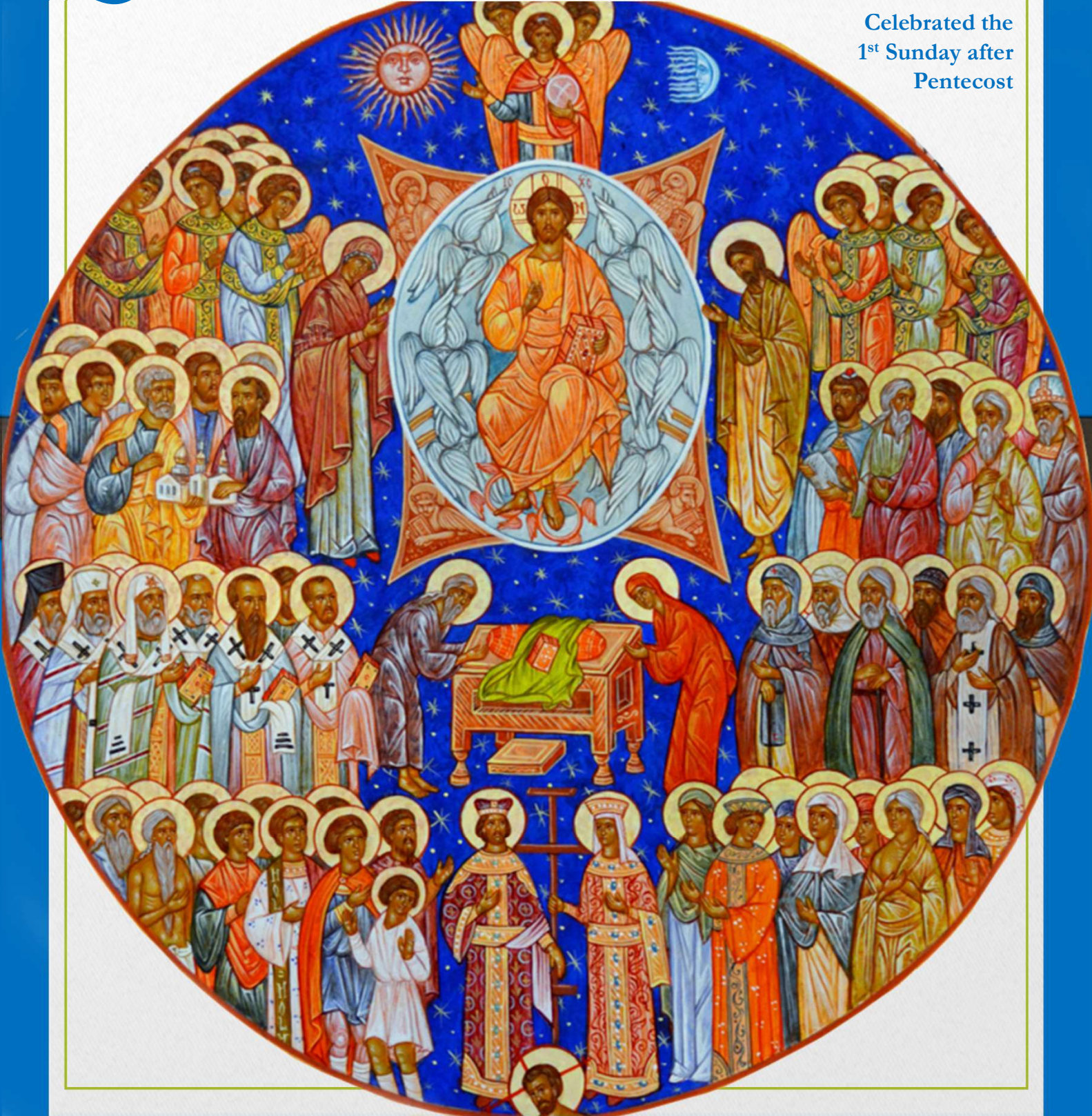

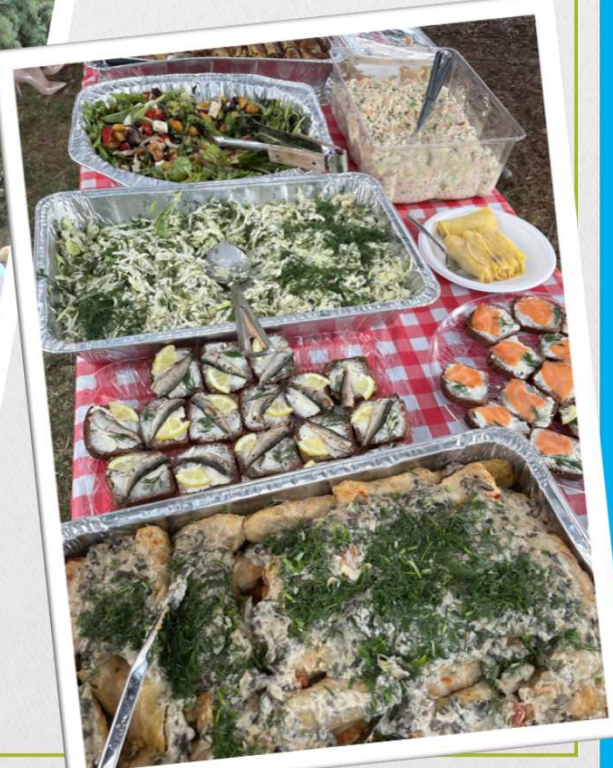

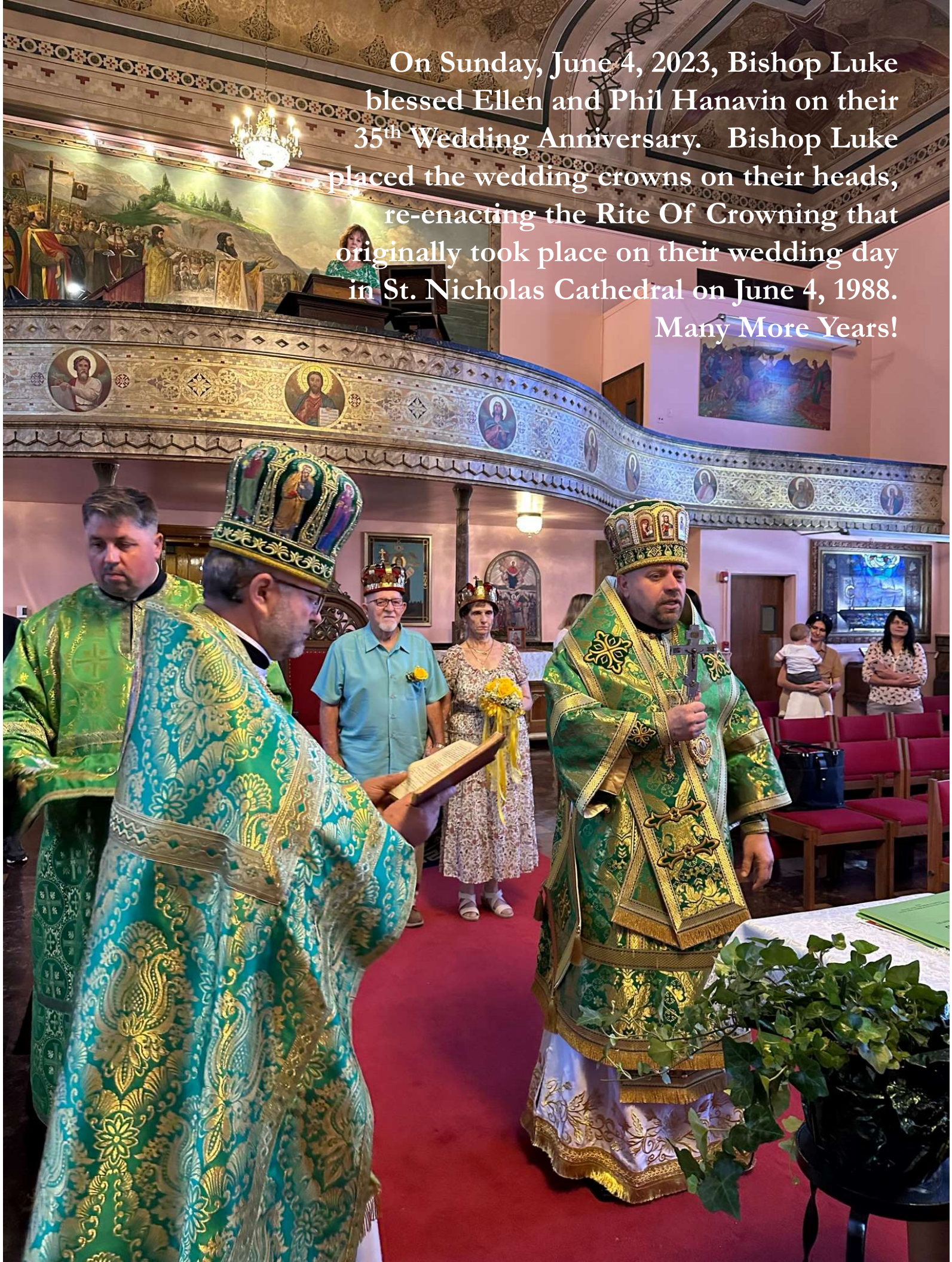

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JUNE 11, 2023

1ST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST – ALL SAINTS



PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 8th Tone: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

CHOIR: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

READER: In Judah God is known. His Name is great in Israel! Pray and make your vows.

CHOIR: Before the Lord our God!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Hebrews.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...who through faith subdued kingdoms, worked righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became valiant in battle, turned to flight the armies of the aliens. Women received their dead raised to life again. Others were tortured, not accepting deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection. Still others had trial of mockings and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented- of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us. Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. **(Hebrews 11:33-12:2)**

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. Therefore whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me before men, him I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven. He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me. Then Peter answered and said to Him, "See, we have left all and followed You. Therefore what shall we have?" So Jesus said to them, "Assuredly I say to you, that in the regeneration, when the Son of Man sits on the throne of His glory, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My name's sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last first. **(Matthew 10:32-33; 37-38; 19:27-30)**

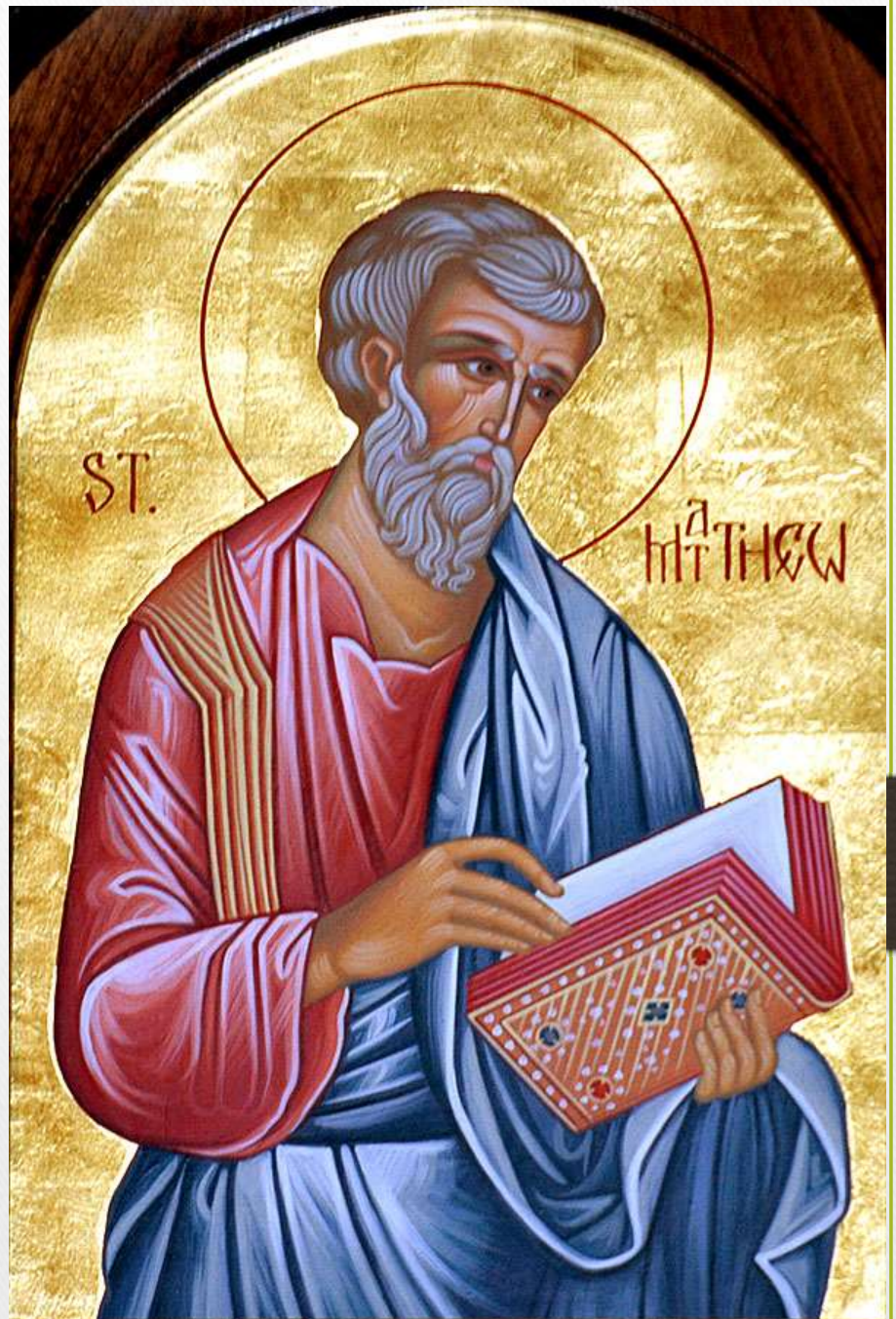

Scripture Reading

for Sunday, June 11, 2023
Matthew 10:32-33; 37-38; 19:-27-30

Today's Scripture reading is short – and its message is very clear: **WHAT IS YOUR REWARD FOR FOLLOWING CHRIST?** The answer is: **ETERNAL LIFE.** Eternity in God's presence. Eternity in God's family. Today we commemorate all the extraordinary saints who gave up everything to follow Jesus. They gave up their families, jobs and possessions to follow Christ and preach His teachings, with the promise of eternal life. Must **YOU** give up everything?



All the Church asks of you is to give up your time to follow Christ – just 1 hour on a Sunday morning! And then devote time to doing good works in the Church. As you know, there is no end to the work that is needed in the Church. We know that there are faithful, dedicated people in our Church family who organize, cook, comfort, teach, pray, preach, clean, sing and more. The work is just waiting for true followers of Christ to step up and say “**HERE I AM, LORD. PUT ME TO WORK.
