

On this Seventh Sunday of Pascha, June 5, 2022, we commemorate the Holy Fathers of the First Ecumenical Council, convened in 325 AD by Emperor Constantine the Great. Participating in the Council were Saint Nicholas, Archbishop of Myra in Lycia, Saint Spyridon, Bishop of Tremithos, and others venerated by the Church as Holy Fathers. Most notable is that the Council composed the Creed. As the "Holy Symbol of Faith" for Orthodox Christians, the Creed is recited by the faithful at every Divine Liturgy. They also decided the date for the celebration of Holy Pascha, that is, Pascha should not be celebrated by Christians on the same day as the Jewish Passover, but on the first Sunday after the first full moon of the vernal equinox.

Bishop Luke's Sermon – Sunday, May 29, 2022 -John 9:1-38

Christ is Risen! Our Bible reading today, the 6th Sunday of Pascha, is about Jesus and the blind man. Just as Jesus gave the blind man his sight after he obeyed and washed in the pool, Jesus can give you, too, courage, faith and spiritual sight! It does not matter whether you have been faithfully going to church since you were born - or just recently entered our church doors - when you experience the light of Jesus Christ, it is a spiritual awakening that can happen again and again throughout your life. Like the words of the hymn sung today: "You, Christ, are the most radiant light of those in darkness."



THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, JUNE 5, 2022

7TH SUNDAY OF PASCHA – FATHERS OF THE FIRST ECUMENICAL COUNCIL

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 6th Tone: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance!

CHOIR: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance!

READER: To Thee, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! O Lord, save Thy people.

CHOIR: And bless Thine inheritance!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Acts.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...For Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus, so that he would not have to spend time in Asia; for he was hurrying to be at Jerusalem, if possible, on the Day of Pentecost. From Miletus he sent to Ephesus and called for the elders of the church. And when they had come to him, he said to them: "You know, from the first day that I came to Asia, in what manner I always lived among you, Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. For I know this, that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock. Also from among yourselves men will rise up, speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after themselves. Therefore watch and remember that for three years I did not cease to warn everyone night and day with tears. So now, brethren, I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified. I have coveted no one's silver or gold or apparel. Yes, you yourselves know that these hands have provided for my necessities, and for those who were with me. I have shown you in every way, by laboring like this, that you must support the weak. And remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' And when he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all.

(Acts 20:16-18; 28-36)

PRIEST: Peace be unto thee, Reader.

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: Alleluia! Alleluia! CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

READER: He who dwells in the shelter of the Most-High will abide in the shadow of the heavenly God!

He will say to the Lord: "My Protector and my Refuge; my God, in whom I trust!"

CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

PRIEST: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint John.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You, as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him. And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent. I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do. And now, O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was. I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word. Now they have known that all things which You have given Me are from You. For I have given to them the words which You have given Me; and they have received them, and have known surely that I came forth from You; and they have believed that You sent Me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours. And all Mine are Yours, and Yours are Mine, and I am glorified in them. Now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep through Your name those whom You have given Me, that they may be one as We are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept; and none of them is lost except the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I come to You, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have My joy fulfilled in themselves. (John 17:1-13)

EXTERIOR PANTING PROJECT: UPDATE

You may recall that our campaign to raise funds to paint the exterior walls of the Cathedral building began in October 2021. In our October 31, 2021, Bulletin we announced that your donations to this project would be matched by an anonymous PRIVATE TRUST.

Patching the cracks and painting with special elastomeric paint began on Tuesday, May 31, 2022, by John and his crew at Hawthorne Painting. Hawthorne did a first-class job patching and painting the front of our Cathedral, including the massive white pillars, in March 2020, and we are confident that they will do a superior job on the remaining exterior walls of the building, including our exterior metal doors. The project should be completed within 2 weeks.
