MESSAGE FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT, Tom Hanney

ROOF Recently, the Church Council Officers and I have had many conversations about the roof on our beautiful church building. Simply put, the wrong type of roof was installed in 2017. It is a polyurethane roof not suitable for a pitched roof line. It provides absolutely no traction for snow and ice.

For those of you who have been coming to church throughout the month of February, you saw how dangerous the conditions were surrounding the building. Large sheets of snow and ice formed and were falling off throughout the day and night. In 2019 we lost all four awnings over our exterior doors to ice damage. Those awnings were replaced and since there was no snow in 2020, the awnings remained in place.

Unfortunately, with the large amounts of snow that fell in our area in 2021, we again lost all four awnings to avalanches of snow. We decided before anyone is seriously injured or worse, we need to make a decision about replacing the roof. At this time, we decided we will not replace the awnings until the proper roof is installed. The cost of the damaged awnings to date has been more than \$2,800.00.

In addition, during the warm months of the summer, moisture builds up between the old shingles and polyurethane cover which we have learned can cause irreparable damage to the under layer of the roof. Having considered all the alternatives (e.g., snow blocks), I asked Barbara Latsios, who along with Susan Guz, is on the "Capital Improvement Committee" for St. Nicholas Church, to obtain bids for a new, asphalt shingle roof. We have already received two bids and are awaiting two more. I will discuss with you the results of the bids and our next steps to replace the roof at our Semi-Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday, March 21. Please plan on attending.

Mid-Year Report from Hall Manager Susan Guz

Greetings!

Our beautiful Church Hall is known to "insiders" by that name. But to the outside world – the folks who rent our Hall – it is known as "Liberty North Banquet & Event Space" – and even has its own logo!

Renting the Hall, using ironclad contracts written by our lawyer, Laura Solomon and Associates, brings in much needed additional income for St. Nicholas Cathedral.

Last year at our budget meeting, the Council gave me the goal of generating \$20,000 income for the Hall year 2020-2021, a low target pre-COVID, but a big challenge with ever-changing COVID restrictions.

I am happy to report that Hall rentals are picking up again, and we are more than half-way to that \$20,000 goal!

Did you know that the Hall is rented every weekday night for "12-Step" group meetings? Other events include comedy shows, baby and wedding showers, birthday parties, motivational meetings, and last-minute memorial repasts. I give Hall tours when requested and meet clients at their convenience. Having a manager who lives within walking distance to St. Nicholas Cathedral is a big plus!

The only downside is the expected "wear and tear" on the Hall. But a paintbrush is always at the ready to touch up scratches and nicks. All of our parishioners are vigilant to keep the hall tidy and attractive at all times. Just recently, church member Nazarii Kalyniuk, a plumber by trade, changed unsightly, rusted, exposed drainpipes in the men's bathroom, an eyesore even for a bathroom! Soon, new – more durable – vinyl tablecloths for both our round and rectangle tables will arrive – hopefully in time for Easter. Our current oilcloth tablecloths lasted 4 years.

And finally, last month I pledged \$5,000 from the Hall Fund to bolster the newly-established Roof Fund. That sum will be transferred before year-end.

A special thank-you, too, to church member Christopher Borriello, who is our on-site manager during late-night events, making sure that parties end on time and responding to other assorted, unexpected situations that may arise.

Parable of Father Bohdan's

Today's Scripture reading makes it clear that Jesus is everywhere and especially in the lives among the unfortunate. Indeed, Jesus says He is one of the unfortunate people. Jesus' words: "As you gave others food or drink or clothes, you did it to me." There are dozens of references in the Bible to helping the poor and those who suffer from misfortune, oppression, or sickness. And will I will YOU -- be judged by our actions when we encounter such unfortunate people? Most definitely YES. Jesus makes this spiritual lesson simple for us. In the parable in today's Scripture, He divides people into 2 groups: the sheep and the goats. The sheep are the compassionate givers; the disciples of Christ; the goats are the uncaring, selfish people who consciously decide not to follow Christ. And the sheep, by their nature, came to the aid of the needy. Their compassionate deeds are not a struggle, not a burden, but a natural act. You see a hungry, thirsty stranger, you give them food and drink without hesitation. The way to the Kingdom of God is by doing good. It is our duty to all mankind. When we do good to any man, we do good to God. We are given free will to choose what to do. And you have chosen to be good sheep. You are here listening to the words of Jesus Christ. I witness the good works you do. And you, the blessed, shall inherit the Kingdom of God. AMEN.
