The collage of icons on the cover of this week's Bulletin was designed to commemorate **Orthodoxy Sunday** and the return of icons into churches in the year 843 following a great conflict between the Iconoclasts and Iconophiles. The Iconophiles prevailed and we celebrate this victory on Sunday, March 21, on Orthodoxy Sunday.

The Iconoclasts were those who feared too much devotion was given icons in Orthodox worship and ultimately ALL icons were removed from Orthodox churches. However, the Iconophiles believed the opposite: that icons represented the divine through art and beauty. The outcome was a decree that restored icons in the churches...a decree that proclaimed icons could be VENERATED and HONORED, but not WORSHIPPED, as worship was due only God.

Bring your most treasured and meaningful icon to St. Nicholas Cathedral on Sunday to carry during our procession of icons immediately following Divine Liturgy -- as we proclaim Orthodoxy as our true faith.

-- the kadilo -- echoed in the Sanctuary.


**Great Lent began immediately** following the Prokeimenon about halfway through the service.


Father Bohdan then emerged from the Royal Doors wearing deep purple vestments. The censer was swung in silence. The Patriarchal Choir sang in Lenten tones.

The Sisterhood changed the scarves on the furnishings in the Sanctuary to purple. Vigil candles shone through purple glass votives.

Church Council President, Tom Hanney, led the rite of forgiveness at the conclusion of the Vespers service. "Forgive me...."

Thus, the congregation participated in a true spiritual event as we begin a mutual journey through Great Lent to Pascha.



# Father Bohdan's SERMON Sunday, March 14, 2021

Great Lent begins tomorrow. And the Scripture gives instructions on how we are to behave during the next 40 days.

There are 2 things to do:



Number 2: The challenging part, the difficult part, sometimes the part we never can resolve is when WE are ASKED to forgive. How can we forgive when we still feel the hurt of someone's words or actions? Sometimes the pain is as fresh as the day it happened even though it may be 50 years ago! We hold grudges, we resent, we are bitter.

And then every year we can be assured of this day -- TODAY - Forgiveness Sunday - and Lent - and Confession - when we are continually given the opportunity to put the past transgressions of others aside, to reflect deeply, to contemplate, to meditate, to ponder, to pray - and then to FORGIVE OTHERS for their trespasses against us.

For the Scripture again is clear. IF YOU FORGIVE MEN THEIR TRESPASSES, YOUR HEAVENLY FATHER WILL ALSO FORGIVE YOU.

So as we begin Lent, unburden yourself of ill will, unkind thoughts, hate and negative emotions. Welcome the Fast as a time to purify your body with healthy foods, a healthy mind and spirit and healthy prayers. And again, as the Scripture says, when you fast, do not do so with a sad face. Let no one know – except God.

#### MESSAGE FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT, Tom Hanney

ROOF Recently, the Church Council Officers and I have had many conversations about the roof on our beautiful church building. Simply put, the wrong type of roof was installed in 2017. It is a polyurethane roof not suitable for a pitched roof line. It provides absolutely no traction for snow and ice.

For those of you who have been coming to church throughout the month of February, you saw how dangerous the conditions were surrounding the building. Large sheets of snow and ice formed and were falling off throughout the day and night. In 2019 we lost all four awnings over our exterior doors to ice damage. Those awnings were replaced and since there was no snow in 2020, the awnings remained in place.

Unfortunately, with the large amounts of snow that fell in our area in 2021, we again lost all four awnings to avalanches of snow. We decided before anyone is seriously injured or worse, we need to make a decision about replacing the roof. At this time, we decided we will not replace the awnings until the proper roof is installed. The cost of the damaged awnings to date has been more than \$2,800.00.

In addition, during the warm months of the summer, moisture builds up between the old shingles and polyurethane cover which we have learned can cause irreparable damage to the under layer of the roof. Having considered all the alternatives (e.g., snow blocks), I asked Barbara Latsios, who along with Susan Guz, is on the "Capital Improvement Committee" for St. Nicholas Church, to obtain bids for a new, asphalt shingle roof. We have already received two bids and are awaiting two more. I will discuss with you the results of the bids and our next steps to replace the roof at our Semi-Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday, March 21. Please plan on attending.

# THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, MARCH 21, 2021



FEAST OF THE TRIUMPH OF ORTHODOXY

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

**READER**: And to thy spirit.

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 4th Tone: Blessed art Thou, O Lord God of our fathers and praised and glorified is Thy name forever!

**READER:** For Thou art just in all that Thou hast done for us. Blessed art Thou, O Lord God of our fathers.

READER: Brothers...By faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he looked to the reward. And what more shall I say? For the time would fail me to tell of Gideon and Barak and Samson and Jephthah, also of David and Samuel and the prophets: who through faith subdued kingdoms, worked righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became valiant in battle, turned to flight the armies of the aliens. Women received their dead raised to life again. Others were tortured, not accepting deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection. Still others had trial of mockings and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented -- of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us. Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. 






We welcome you to St. Nicholas Orthodox Cathedral to worship and pray with us during this most solemn week leading up to the glorious Resurrection of Christ.




