Sunday of Great Lent, the Soly Cross
is brought forth from the Altar and
placed in the center of the church on the
Analoi Table for veneration by the
faithful. During the prostrations made
before the Cross, the Choir sings:
"Before Thy Cross, we bow down in
worship, O Master, and Thy holy
Resurrection we glorify." The Church
has set this event in the middle of Great
Lent in order that the recollection of the
suffering of Jesus Christ on the Cross
might inspire and strengthen those fasting
for the remainder of Great Lent.


during these Panikhidas.

ANNUAL ENDOWMENT FUND DRIVE





Father Bohdan's Sermon March 15, 2020 Mark 2:1-12

Today's Scripture reading is about the paralytic man who was carried on a pallet and lowered through the roof of a house where a huge crowd was gathered to hear Jesus Christ preach. It is a remarkable account of an extraordinary act compelled by faith. Jesus was so moved by this incredible feat that He told the paralytic man that his sins were forgiven. And then began an interchange between the scribes and Jesus. The scribes were stuck on Jesus' words, even to the point of accusing Him of blasphemy. Jesus responded with different words: He said to the paralytic man, ARISE, TAKE UP YOUR BED AND WALK. The lesson I share with you today is this: do not let words get in the way of what you want to achieve by your faith and spiritual goals. Actions speak louder than words. And whether Jesus said to the paralytic man: your sins are forgiven, or arise, take up your bed and walk, the result was the same. An amazing miracle occurred, and the crowd who witnessed it was changed forever. So, instead of talking, take action for the glory of God. Take action driven by your faith. Take action in the name of Jesus Christ. Let your faith be synonymous with action. Believe, and act on it. And you, too, may make a difference in someone's life forever. AMEN.

Turn away Your anger from Your servants. Take away Your terrible sword, which is righteously lifted up against us, Your poor and weak servants. Do not punish us, O Merciful Lord, for our iniquities, foolishness, pride and impatience with one another, for our wickedness and insincere, false love. Lord, Jesus Christ our God, though you punish, you also show mercy as the Father of the Prodigal Son. Remember the great sufferings of Your people, the persecution of the Church, the exiled and the tortured, and because we did not lose faith in You, the only True God, in suffering and in captivity, we pray that You have compassion on us now. We thank You for Your mercy and Your boundless love. Although we sin before You, we serve You only. And now, look upon us, O Lord of Love, forgive our trespasses and deliver us from sickness. Be merciful. Your Church, for which You shed Your blood on the Cross, prays to You. Forgive us so that we may always glorify Your holy name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen."

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, MARCH 22 VENERATION OF THE CROSS

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: Brothers...Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest taken from among men is appointed for men in things pertaining to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can have compassion on those who are ignorant and going astray, since he himself is also subject to weakness. Because of this he is required as for the people, so also for himself, to offer sacrifices for sins. And no man takes this honor to himself, but he who is called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but it was He who said to Him: "You are My Son, Today I have begotten You." As He also says in another place: "You are a priest forever According to the order of Melchizedek." **(Hebrews 4:14-5:6)**

For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him the Son of Man also will be ashamed when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels. And He said to them, "Assuredly, I say to you that there are some standing here who will not taste death till they see the kingdom of God present with power." (Mark 8:34-9:1)
