# THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, MARCH 7, 2021



MEATFARE SUNDAY

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

**READER**: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

**READER**: The Prokeimenon in the 6<sup>th</sup> Tone: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance!

CHOIR: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance!

**READER:** To Thee, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! O Lord, save Thy people.

**CHOIR**: And bless Thine inheritance!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

**READER**: The reading is from the Corinthians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

**READER:** Brothers...But food does not commend us to God; for neither if we eat are we the better, nor if we do not eat are we the worse. But beware lest somehow this liberty of yours become a stumbling block to those who are weak. For if anyone sees you who have knowledge eating in an idol's temple, will not the conscience of him who is weak be emboldened to eat those things offered to idols? And because of your knowledge shall the weak brother perish, for whom Christ died? But when you thus sin against the brethren, and wound their weak conscience, you sin against Christ. Therefore, if food makes my brother stumble, I will never again eat meat, lest I make my brother stumble. Am I not an apostle? Am I not free? Have I not seen Jesus Christ our Lord? Are you not my work in the Lord? If I am not an apostle to others, yet doubtless I am to you. For you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord. (1 Corinthians 8:8-9:2)

**PRIEST:** Peace be unto thee, Reader.

**READER:** And to thy spirit.

READER: Alleluia! Alleluia! CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

**READER:** He who dwells in the shelter of the Most-High will abide in the shadow of the heavenly God!

**PRIEST**: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

PRIEST: Let us attend. When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the holy angels with Him, then He will sit on the throne of His glory. All the nations will be gathered before Him, and He will separate them one from another, as a shepherd divides his sheep from the goats. And He will set the sheep on His right hand, but the goats on the left. Then the King will say to those on His right hand, 'Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: 'for I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in; 'I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me.' Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? 'When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? 'Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?' And the King will answer and say to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.' Then He will also say to those on the left hand, 'Depart from Me, you cursed, into the everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels: 'for I was hungry and you gave Me no food; I was thirsty and you gave Me no drink; 'I was a stranger and you did not take Me in, naked and you did not clothe Me, sick and in prison and you did not visit Me.' Then they also will answer Him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to You?' Then He will answer them, saying, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me.' And these will go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into eternal life. (Matthew 25:31-46)

# A Historic Day



The Stavropigia parish of St. Nicholas Orthodox Cathedral in Philadelphia in the United States for the first time celebrated the status of a cathedral and the opportunity to be called the center and head office of the Vicariate of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church Kyivan Patriarchate. After the reading of the Holy Gospel, the Rector of the Cathedral and the Secretary of the Vicariate, Very Reverend Bohdan Zhoba, delivered a sermon. Father Bohdan congratulated the congregation on an important achievement that belongs to everyone in the congregation: that today the parish can lay claim to the dignity of becoming the chair of the ruling bishop.

"May our prayer today become an important act of gratitude to God for His benevolence to all of us, to everyone who comes to this holy temple. Now we need to redouble our joint efforts to serve God and His pious people, those who need care, support and prayer," said Father Bohdan. At the end of the prayer of thanksgiving, the Patriarchal Choir, led by Choir Director, Susan Guz, sang "Many Years" to Patriarch Philaret. Father Bohdan, together with the parishioners, congratulated the long-term Church Council President, Thomas Hanney, on his birthday, wishing him good health and God's mercy. Father Bohdan also conveyed a blessing from His Holiness Patriarch Philaret. In honor of the occasion, all present sang "Many Years" to the beloved old age of the Cathedral! At the end of the service, the congregation attended a party to celebrate the high status of the Cathedral. The Sisterhood, led by President, Barbara Latsios, and Judy Hanney, organized a gala luncheon. The band led by Igor Sypnya performed for an appreciative crowd! Thank God for everything!
