

Sunday of The Myrrh Bearing Women

The Gospels record the faithfulness of Christ's women disciples at the Cross. The women went to the tomb to anoint Jesus'
body with myrrh-oils and spices but found the tomb empty. As they wondered what this meant, angels appeared proclaiming
that Christ had risen from the dead. So the "myrrh bearing women" were the first to find out about Christ's Resurrection.
This event is celebrated in the Orthodox church on the Third Sunday after Pascha. Holy tradition names eight

myrrh-bearers: the Virgin Mary; Mary Magdalene; Mary, the wife of Cleophas; Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward; Sa<mark>lome,</mark> the mother of the sons of Zebedee, James and John; Susanna; Mary, the sister of Lazarus; Martha, the sister of Laza<mark>rus.</mark>





THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, MAY 16, 2021

3RD SUNDAY OF PASCHA – MYRRH BEARING WOMEN

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 6th Tone: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance!

CHOIR: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance!

READER: To Thee, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! O Lord, save Thy people.

CHOIR: And bless Thine inheritance!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Acts of the Holy Apostles.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...Now in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying, there arose a complaint against the Hebrews by the Hellenists, because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution. Then the twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables. Therefore, brethren, seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business; but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word. And the saying pleased the whole multitude. And they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch, whom they set before the apostles; and when they had prayed, they laid hands on them. Then the word of God spread, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith. (Acts 6:1-7)

PRIEST: Peace be unto thee, Reader.

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

READER: He who dwells in the shelter of the Most-High will abide in the shadow of the heavenly God!

He will say to the Lord: "My Protector and my Refuge; my God, in whom I trust!

CHOIR: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

PRIEST: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent council member, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, coming and taking courage, went in to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Pilate marveled that He was already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him if He had been dead for some time. So when he found out from the centurion, he granted the body to Joseph. Then he bought fine linen, took Him down, and wrapped Him in the linen. And he laid Him in a tomb which had been hewn out of the rock, and rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. And Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses observed where He was laid. Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away-for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples-and Peter-that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you. So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. (Mark 15:43-16:8)

Father Bohdan's Sermon - Sunday, May 9, 2021 JOHN 20:19-31

Christ is Risen!

Happy Mother's Day! The Akathist to the Holy Theotokos we just prayed was in honor of all our mothers, Godmothers, grandmothers, aunts, sisters and all women who nurture and comfort us.

Today is also St. Thomas Sunday, the first Sunday after Easter also called "Antipascha," and this is the first opportunity we have to commemorate the departed as panikhidas are forbidden in the Orthodox Church from Holy Thursday through today, a period of 11 days. Therefore, today is when we can finally announce the Resurrection of Christ to those who have departed this life before us. We will also share with the departed our blessed Pascha bread and Easter eggs. We will gather at Oakland Cemetery immediately following the brunch downstairs hosted by Marcia O'Connor in memory of her father, Michael, on the 5th anniversary of his passing. Our pilgrimage to the cemeteries and blessing the graves is a beautiful, important custom in our Orthodox church, and one that parents should teach their children. Everyone should make the effort to visit the graves of our beloved departed for they depending on us. They should never be forgotten. Memory Eternal! Christ is Risen!
