



Following Divine Liturgy, Archbishop Andriy spoke to all those gathered in the Cathedral for the Celebration of the 25th Anniversary of the Enthronement of Patriarch Philaret. Here is an excerpt of his remarks:

"Your Holiness! On behalf of the Council of Bishops, clergy, monks, believers of Ukraine and the diaspora, scholars and all Ukrainian intellectuals, accept cordial congratulations on the 25th Anniversary of your Patriarchal enthronement. Under your wise leadership, the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the Kyiv Patriarchate shows spiritual resilience. We are grateful to the Lord that in the person of Your Holiness we see an example of the spirit and strength to endure and remain on the path of Christ in the current difficult conditions. From day to day you work with full effort and talent, convincingly showing us all an inspiring example of "how to behave in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth" (1 Tim. 3:15). You continue to lay the cornerstones for the construction of churches and hold meetings with heads of state and international institutions, diplomats, military, businessmen, representatives of culture and the public. Despite your respectable age, you continue to take an active part in meetings of representatives of embassies of different countries, give interviews, hold press conferences and speak on television programs, where you are inspired to defend the preservation of the Church of Christ of the Kyiv Patriarchate. THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 1

21ST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 4th Tone: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

CHOIR: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

READER: Bless the Lord, O my soul! O my God, Thou art very great! O Lord, how manifold are Thy works!

CHOIR: In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Galatians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified. But if, while we seek to be justified by Christ, we ourselves also are found sinners, is Christ therefore a minister of sin? Certainly not! For if I build again those things which I destroyed, I make myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. **(Galatians 2:16-20)**

PRIEST: Let us attend. A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some fell by the wayside; and it was trampled down, and the birds of the air devoured it. Some fell on rock; and as soon as it sprang up, it withered away because it lacked moisture. And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up with it and choked it. But others fell on good ground, sprang up, and yielded a crop a hundredfold. When He had said these things He cried, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear! Then His disciples asked Him, saying, "What does this parable mean?" And He said, "To you it has been given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest it is given in parables, that 'Seeing they may not see, And hearing they may not understand.' Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. Those by the wayside are the ones who hear; then the devil comes and takes away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved. But the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring no fruit to maturity. But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience. **(Luke 8:5-15)**






