



Sermon

"I am the good Shepherd." These words are repeated twice in today's Scripture reading. And who is the good Shepherd? Jesus Christ.

The Scripture reading explains the role of the shepherd as he tends to his flock of sheep, and the great responsibility of the shepherd to manage and care for the flock. It would seem easy to live the life of a sheep. No thinking necessary. Just follow the shepherd. And if we substitute all of us for the sheep, then we would be guaranteed eternal life. Yet, we were not created with a sheep's brain. We were created with free will, to act independently and to make choices. The Shepherd – Jesus Christ – will care for us and guide us and teach us. But do we listen? Left to ourselves, do we always make the right decisions? Follow the right path? How easy it would be just to submit to the Shepherd. But we do not. We resist, we challenge, we defy, we reject the Shepherd. Today's Scripture reading reminds us that we have two choices in life: either we recognize that we need the Shepherd to guide us through this challenging, sometimes difficult, life; or we break away from the flock and stray off course, susceptible to all the temptations of life. The responsibility is yours. The choice is yours. As your spiritual leader, I urge you to follow the voice of your Shepherd, Jesus Christ. AMEN.

25TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 8th Tone: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

CHOIR: Pray and make your vows before the Lord our God!

READER: In Judah God is known. His Name is great in Israel! Pray and make your vows.

CHOIR: Before the Lord our God!

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Hebrews.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...For such a High Priest was fitting for us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens; who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the people's, for this He did once for all when He offered up Himself. For the law appoints as high priests men who have weakness, but the word of the oath, which came after the law, appoints the Son who has been perfected forever. Now this is the main point of the things we are saying: We have such a High Priest, who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens, a Minister of the sanctuary and of the true tabernacle which the Lord erected, and not man. **(Hebrews 7:26-8:2)**

PRIEST: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint John.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.


PRIEST: Let us attend. I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture. The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly. I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep. But a hireling, he who is not the shepherd, one who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees; and the wolf catches the sheep and scatters them. The hireling flees because he is a hireling and does not care about the sheep. I am the good shepherd; and I know My sheep, and am known by My own. As the Father knows Me, even so I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep. And other sheep I have which are not of this fold; them also I must bring, and they will hear My voice; and there will be one flock and one shepherd. **(John 10:9-16)**
