News from Father Luke in Ukraine

The Monastic Vows of the Secretary of the Vicariate of the UOC-Kyiv Patriarchate in the USA & Canada are Concluded

On October 29, 2021, following the evening service, the Secretary of the Vicariate of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the Kyiv Patriarchate in the USA & Canada, Very Reverend Bohdan Zhoba, was ordained a monk. With the blessing of His Holiness Patriarch Philaret of Kyiv and All Rus'-Ukraine, Archbishop Andriy of Pereyaslav and Bila Tserkva performed the monastic vows in the house church of the Kyiv Patriarchate in honor of the righteous Filaret the Merciful. During the vows, Father Bohdan received the new name of Luke in monasticism, in honor of the holy apostle and evangelist Luke. Welcoming Hieromonk Luke, Bishop Andrew urged the newly-ordained monk to sincerely pray, especially the prayer of Jesus, to have sacrificial obedience to the church, and to always remember the vows he made in the temple, keeping in his heart the love of God and his neighbors. After the vows, Hieromonk Luke remained in the holy temple, where the reading of the Psalms began.

UPDATE: Father Bohdan returned from Ukraine on Monday, November 1. From now on, we are to address him as Father Luke.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 2021

20TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 3rd Tone: Sing praises to our God, sing praises! Sing praises to our King, sing praises!

CHOIR: Clap your hands, all ye people! Shout to God with loud songs of joy! Sing praises to our God, sing praises!

READER: Sing praises to our King, sing praises!

CHOIR: He has become my salvation.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Galacians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...But I make known to you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not according to man. For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through the revelation of Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my former conduct in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God beyond measure and tried to destroy it. And I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my contemporaries in my own nation, being more exceedingly zealous for the traditions of my fathers. But when it pleased God, who separated me from my mother's womb and called me through His grace, to reveal His Son in me, that I might preach Him among the Gentiles, I did not immediately confer with flesh and blood, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me; but I went to Arabia, and returned again to Damascus. Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to see Peter and remained with him fifteen days. But I saw none of the other apostles except James, the Lord's brother. (**Galatians 1:11-19**)

PRIEST: Peace be unto thee, Reader.

READER: And to thy spirit.

READER: In Thee, O Lord, have I placed my hope. Let me not be put to shame!

Be Thou a God of protection for me, a house of refuge, in order to save me!

PRIEST: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us listen to the Holy Gospel. Peace be unto all.

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. There was a certain rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and fared sumptuously every day. But there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, full of sores, who was laid at his gate, desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table. Moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. So it was that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried. And being in torments in Hades, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. Then he cried and said, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.' But Abraham said, 'Son, remember that in your lifetime you received your good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things; but now he is comforted and you are tormented. 'And besides all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed, so that those who want to pass from here to you cannot, nor can those from there pass to us.' Then he said, 'I beg you therefore, father, that you would send him to my father's house, 'for I have five brothers, that he may testify to them, lest they also come to this place of torment.' Abraham said to him, 'They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham; but if one goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' But he said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded though one rise from the dead.' (Luke 16:19-31)


