#### Father Bohdan's Sermon Sunday, October 4, 2020 Matthew 15:21-28

The title of today's Scripture reading could be: GETTING GOD'S ATTENTION. The Caananite woman in today's Scripture was like the hungry dog - completely focused only on one thing --Jesus healing her daughter. We can learn a lot from this woman. In order to get God's attention we need to FOCUS hard on what you want from our Lord. While focusing is essential, we also learn from the Canaanite woman to use EMPATHY. She asks for mercy: "Lord, Son of David, have mercy on me! My daughter is suffering terribly from demon-possession." She was also PERSISTENT. The disciples tell Jesus she will not quit. And she had great FAITH. Jesus said: "Woman, you have great faith! Your request is granted." And her daughter was healed immediately. Truly, with focus, empathy, persistence and faith, if you want something bad enough you will figure out a way to get it – just like the Caananite woman did not quit when she had a crisis in her life. AMEN.





Followed by a Procession Saturday, November 14


