

The Protection of the Holy Mother of God Theotokos

The miraculous appearance of the Mother of God occurred in the mid-10th Century in Constantinople, in the Blachernae Church where her robe, veil, and part of her belt were preserved after being transferred from Palestine in the 5th Century.

On a Sunday during an all-night vigil when the church was overflowing with those at prayer, the most Holy Lady Theotokos appeared, resplendent with heavenly light and surrounded by an assembly of Saints. She took her veil and spread it over the people praying in church, protecting them from enemies both visible and invisible.

The full name of the Sisterhood organized in St. Nicholas Church back in 1931 is "The Sisterhood of the Protection (in Slavic, "Pokrova") of the Holy Theotokos." In 1939, the Sisterhood purchased from Europe a beautiful gold-plated cross for \$600 that still stands in the center of the church. And then in 1945, the Sisterhood donated the magnificent chandelier that illuminates our church.

Next year, the Sisterhood will celebrate its 90th Year! This group of women remains an integral part of the parish to this day.

To commemorate the Feast Day for which the Sisterhood is named, a celebratory lunch is held annually. This year's lunch will take place on SUNDAY, OCTOBER 18. 


ATTENTION SISTERHOOD MEMBERS:

Father Bohdan's Sermon - Sunday, October 11, 2020 - Luke 5:1-11

In today's Scripture reading, Peter, James and John catch more fish than they have ever caught before....it is the dream of any fisherman. And then they drop everything, leave their nets and boat to follow Jesus. Why would they do that? Because that one big catch they had always dreamed of failed to satisfy them like they thought it would. They faced the nagging question: "Is this all there is? Is this all there is to live for?" God has placed in our hearts the belief that we were made for bigger things. It is because God has set eternity in our hearts that people often examine their lives and ask: Is this all there is? Deep inside their hearts they know - this is NOT all there is. Jesus constantly challenges us to look beyond this life. And as Peter, James and John left everything to follow God, you too can do the same. Turn loose the things you are hanging on to....if you're willing to make God's kingdom that important in your life. If we don't deliberately build our lives around seeking God's Kingdom, we are going to end up building our lives around something else. The choice is yours. You can invest your life in the things of this world. Or you can invest in that which is eternal...the Kingdom of God. Invest in God's Kingdom and life will be more fulfilling and satisfying. AMEN.

Divine Liturgy on the second Sunday of every month.



THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, OCTOBER 18

19TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: Brothers...The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying. In Damascus the governor, under Aretas the king, was guarding the city of the Damascenes with a garrison, desiring to arrest me; but I was let down in a basket through a window in the wall, and escaped from his hands. It is doubtless not profitable for me to boast. I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord: I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago-whether in the body I do not know, or whether out of the body I do not know, God knows-such a one was caught up to the third heaven. And I know such a man-whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows- how he was caught up into Paradise and heard inexpressible words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter. Of such a one I will boast; yet of myself I will not boast, except in my infirmities. For though I might desire to boast, I will not be a fool; for I will speak the truth. But I refrain, lest anyone should think of me above what he sees me to be or hears from me. And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure. Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. (2 Corinthians 11:31-12:9)


CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.




