Excerpt from Father Bohdan's "Pastor's Report"

"Brothers and Sisters, it was certainly a strange year for all of us, here in our parish in Philadelphia and also for everyone in the world. The coronavirus upended our lives. Father Bohdan gave his blessing following the re-election and installation of the Church Council officers.



(CLC is NOT using our parking lot; the CLC congregation will park on 7th Street.)

substitute priest on Sunday, October 4.

Father Bohdan's Sermon Sunday, September 27, 2020 John 19:6-11, 13-20, 25-28, 30-35

Today's Scripture reading is Saint John's account of Christ's crucifixion, a very appropriate reading as today is the Feast Day of the Exaltation – or Elevation – of the Holy Cross. This feast day is a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice for us on the cross. And that the cross is our Christian symbol of eternal life and victory over death. We also celebrate on this day the discovery by Saint Helen in the 4th Century of the actual cross on which Christ was crucified. So it is no wonder that today is a very special day, a strict fast day, and a day when we heard the Choir sing several special hymns during Divine Liturgy. Jesus said: "He who does not take up his cross and follow Me is not worthy of Me." It is a simple statement that defines how we must live to be saved. The cross represents Jesus, and I hold it in my right hand so that you see God's power and wisdom are with us in this sanctuary. And you, too, should wear your cross so that everyone can see that you believe in the power of the crucifix and that God is with you always. AMEN.

PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew.


CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.





Riennial Rlessing of Nets


Followed by a Procession Saturday, November 14
