ANNUAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



President, **Tom Hanney**, gave a comprehensive report on the “State of the Cathedral” and the Endowment Fund. The top three revenue sources continue to be the Hall rentals, the parking lot rentals and the Pierogi Festival – and this income allowed for the completion of many projects during the past year, including: concrete work on the front steps; the acquisition of an AED defibrillator; the removal of a large tree on the south side; new floor tiles installed in the stairwells and Sanctuary foyer; a new ice machine; and new digital programmable timers for the exterior flood lights. On the horizon....possibly remodeling the bathrooms, among other improvements on our “wish list.” Tom aptly concluded with the statement that “*the church has to be run like a business.*”

The Endowment Fund is for long-term financial growth. The parish invested \$11,330.00 into the Fund this past fiscal year (\$6,000.00 as part of our “savings” plan; \$2,665.00 from parishioner donations during the annual EF Drive; and \$2,665.00 matched by the Cathedral). No funds were withdrawn this year. Susan Guz was elected to fill the vacant Endowment Fund Committee member position.

Ellen Hanavin, Treasurer, and **Frank Borriello**, Secretary, presented the financial report for the fiscal year 2022-2023.

And yes, they are smiling because the Cathedral was “in the black.” The financial statements were audited by Jack Pellock.



ANNUAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



Congregational Vote

The Parish voted on changing the start time for Divine Liturgy on Sundays and came to an agreement on the following schedule, with the blessing of Bishop Luke:

- **Summer/Fall Schedule:** Divine Liturgy will start at 9:00 AM (with NO VESTING) from the first Sunday in June until (and including) the first Sunday in November.
- **Winter/Spring Schedule:** Divine Liturgy will start at 9:30 AM (WITH VESTING at 9:15 AM) from the second Sunday in November until the last Sunday in May.

Susan Guz, in her role as Manager of Liberty North Hall, presented the Hall Report. It was a very successful and busy year with 160 events – and those rentals brought in a record \$88,787.00 in revenue (surpassing the \$75,000.00 goal). Needless to say, the Hall remains a very popular venue. Improvements this year included repainting the Hall, installing protective corner moldings on the columns and the addition of elegant beveled mirrors on several walls. The wish list includes possibly raising the drop ceiling in the Hall to its original height, and the Manager will secure several estimates for this huge project. In the short term, a new chair dolly and podium are needed. Colleen Philipp immediately came forward to donate the dolly and podium. THANK YOU, COLLEEN!



ANNUAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



Festival Director, **Judy Hanney**, thanked her volunteer team for participating in the food prep sessions. The donations of labor and money towards a new freezer, beverage fridge and “meatballer” machine are greatly appreciated. This year a Haagen Daz ice cream truck vendor will be parked on the northside during the Festival – and we will get an additional \$500 in revenue from the vendor fee. Individual reports from the Festival team followed. Judy encouraged everyone to take flyers and ask local stores to display them...and that we should all pray for good weather on November 4-5!



President of the “Sisterhood of the Protection of the Holy Theotokos,” **Barbara Latsios**, announced that Secretary, Diane Kavchok, is collecting Sisterhood annual dues – still only \$10 -- starting October 1. She also extended an invitation to please attend the annual Sisterhood Luncheon on Sunday, October 15, with your family and friends. Tickets are \$25 each for adults, and the Luncheon is the Sisterhood’s only fundraising event. The Luncheon is donated every year by Barbara and her sister, Judy Hanney. Barbara also announced that the Sisterhood was recently incorporated -- after 92 years in existence! -- as a non-profit entity in the State of Pennsylvania, a necessary step as banks have become very strict with their rules and regulations and now require official documents (i.e., a Certificate of Incorporation, an EIN and By-Laws) for business accounts.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT: TOM HANNEY**



Greetings! Preparations are underway for our biggest annual fundraiser of the year, led by Festival Director, Judy Hanney: the **PIEROGI FESTIVAL, this year on Saturday, November 4, and Sunday, November 5.**

Published next to this message is the food prep schedule for the Festival. We expect to have dozens of parishioners at every session.

Most of the year we come and go as individuals, with very busy everyday schedules. But at this time of the year, we ask you to perform a Labor of Love for God and your Church. This is about working as a team and having the dedication of a team to succeed. Do this now! Mark it a Priority! Make Saint Nicholas a Priority! Choose as many dates as possible and dedicate yourself to being there for your team.

Showing up when there is work to be done says you are truly a member of Saint Nicholas. Not showing up says you are just a visitor.

The money raised from the Festival will pay the utility bills for the Cathedral and the Rectory. The true cost of operating the Cathedral is approximately \$16,000 per month. If it were not for the Festival, the parking lot rentals and the Hall rentals, we would have to close our doors. Parishioner contributions would not sustain the Cathedral.

As your President and head coach, I thank you in advance for lending a hand and giving the Cathedral a few extra hours of your time during September and October.

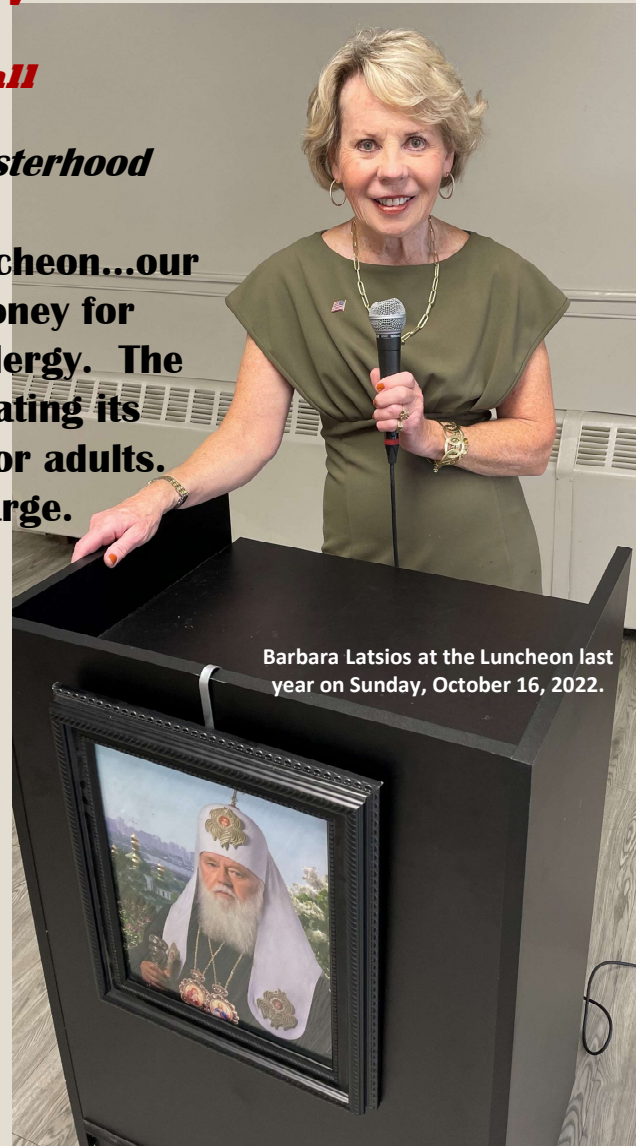

There were many similarities in the Coptic Orthodox marriage ceremony to what we are familiar with, including the “crowning” of the couple. Both are steeped in tradition, ceremony and symbolism. But at Thursday’s wedding, the responses were chanted in Middle Eastern tonalities by deacons. There was also a “Blessing of Adorned Garments,” when Father Michael clothed the bride and groom with decorated vestments identical to that worn by him. And the wedding concluded with loud shouts of joy and celebration from the women in the pews. The distinct, high-pitched sound is known as Zaghareet.
