

Father Bohdan's Sermon - Sunday, October 3, 2021 Mark 8:34-9:1

In today's Scripture reading, Jesus tells us to "Take up your cross and follow Me." These words mean that Jesus is calling us to follow His lead. And to do that, we must deny ourselves and live courageously and unashamed of Jesus Christ. Jesus requires a commitment from us. We cannot be indecisive about our faith in Him. We must be completely devoted to Him with all our heart.

Our faith cannot be passive. Jesus gives us a stern warning about digressing in our faith. You heard that warning in today's Scripture passage: "If anyone is ashamed of Me and My message...the Son of man will be ashamed of that person when He returns..."



So, let today's Scripture reading remind you that vou are a faithful outspoken --Orthodox Christian. Seize every opportunity to preach how your life is good, how your life has changed because of your Orthodox faith and vour love of Christ. Do not deny Him. Go forward in life. unashamed of Jesus Christ. AMEN.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, OCTOBER 10, 2021

16TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit. **PRIEST**: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 7th Tone: The Lord shall give strength to His people! The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

CHOIR: The Lord shall give strength to His people! The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

READER: Brothers...We then, as workers together with Him also plead with you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For He says: In an acceptable time I have heard you, And in the day of salvation I have helped you. Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We give no offense in anything, that our ministry may not be blamed. But in all things we commend ourselves as ministers of God: in much patience, in tribulations, in needs, in distresses, in stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labors, in sleeplessness, in fastings; by purity, by knowledge, by longsuffering, by kindness, by the Holy Spirit, by sincere love, by the word of truth, by the power of God, by the armor of righteousness on the right hand and on the left, by honor and dishonor, by evil report and good report; as deceivers, and yet true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold we live; as chastened, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing all things. (2 Corinthians 6:1-10)

Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat. When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net." And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. So they signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!" For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken; and so also were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Project: Painting the Building's Exterior Walls



As you know, the renovation of the front of our building was finished in March 2020 - and it

was a great success.

Now it is time to focus on the remaining walls of the building -- the north, south and east walls -- not just for aesthetics, but to WATERPROOF the interior.

This is the final step in our waterproofing efforts. The front wall is completed. The roof with snowguards is completed. Caulking all of the windows is completed.

Look at these photos of the many spider cracks in the stucco; the damage done to the north and south stairwells; and our deteriorating Sanctuary wall icons -- all caused by water seepage from the porous exterior walls.


We have received contractor estimates to: power wash the 3 exterior walls, patch the stucco, and seal the cracks with two coats of elastomeric paint.




