Cathedral Council Officers Elected to Serve Another Year





HIGHLIGHTS

Tom Hanney, President, happily announced that it was a very good year for the Cathedral as reported on our income statement which was distributed to attendees. Two major improvements were accomplished this year: the exterior and interior painting of the Cathedral. Projects on the horizon include the repair of the Cathedral's front concrete steps, and the possible restoration of the icons and wall art in the Sanctuary. Copies of a proposal (submitted by iconographer Ekaterina Piskavera) to restore the icons were available for review by the attendees. Tom pointed out that this project is in its beginning stages with more discussion needed.

Frank Borriello, Secretary, and Ellen Hanavin,
Treasurer, presented the current
financial state of the Cathedral and an
outlook for the next fiscal year. With
the current economy, expenses are
expected to increase 10-30% in 2023.
We hope that income – and donations –
will follow the same trend.





The Patriarchal Choir Director, Susan Guz, reported that with the ordination of Bishop Luke almost a year ago, the Divine Liturgy service changed to "Hierarchal," lengthened considerably, and the Choir responses and repertoire became more complex. The Choir rose to the challenge, learned the new music, and Sunday morning worship service continues to be inspiring and spiritually uplifting. Bishop Luke promised that Vesting prayers will start promptly at 9:15 am Sunday mornings.

Susan Guz, in her role as Manager of the Hall, reported that income surpassed its goal for the fiscal year 2021-2022. The Hall hosted 143 events this past fiscal year and continues to be a popular venue – and the Cathedral's primary source of revenue. The rental rate will increase 10% in 2023 to \$995 – and the Manager will strive to deliver continued great customer service to the Hall's clients (many of whom are loyal, repeat customers).


