Saints

We commemorate **Martyr Longinus** the Centurion on Sunday, Oct. 29. St. Longinus and his soldiers were evewitnesses to the crucifixion of Jesus. But the **Roman Centurion** had a moment of epiphany at the site and cried out: "Truly this man was the Son of God."

SCRIPTURE READING & SERMON ON THE 4th SUNDAY OF LUKE SUNDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2023

LUKE 8:5-15



In Sunday's Scripture reading, Luke relates a parable that is very familiar to us: the parable of the SOWER. It is a simple parable as it is easy to identify the symbolism: The sower is the preacher. The seeds are the word of God. And the soil, the ground, are all those who hear God's word. I will focus on the SOIL because this is the part of the parable that is about YOU. What kind of soil are you?



The parable identifies four types of believers: The "wayside soil" are those who hear and do not believe. They are VOID of faith. The "rocky soil" are those with a LITTLE faith, the person who lacks roots, the person who believes for a while and then loses interest. The "thorny soil" are those of VERY WEAK faith, the person involved in the world's activities who becomes choked with the cares, riches and pleasures of this life. And lastly there is the "good ground" which represents people of GREAT faith.

I ask you again: what type of soil are you? Only God knows! But as your Bishop, I say you are GOOD SOIL! You have roots. I see the same people every week. YOU ARE GOOD GROUND. FAITHFUL, DEDICATED, BELIEVERS. Look around you and remember the faces of people who came to St. Nicholas Cathedral through the years, maybe for just one Sunday, maybe for a few weeks or a few months, and then disappeared. They got excited for a while when they heard the word of God. But then left. Thank God that you are here. You are all GOOD SOIL. AMEN.

21ST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 4th Tone: O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all!

READER: The reading is from the Galatians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified. But if, while we seek to be justified by Christ, we ourselves also are found sinners, is Christ therefore a minister of sin? Certainly not! For if I build again those things which I destroyed, I make myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. **(Galatians 2:16-20)**

CHOIR: And to thy spirit.


PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

PRIEST: Let us attend. A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some fell by the wayside; and it was trampled down, and the birds of the air devoured it. Some fell on rock; and as soon as it sprang up, it withered away because it lacked moisture. And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up with it and choked it. But others fell on good ground, sprang up, and yielded a crop a hundredfold. When He had said these things He cried, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear! Then His disciples asked Him, saying, "What does this parable mean?" And He said, "To you it has been given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest it is given in parables, that 'Seeing they may not see, And hearing they may not understand.' Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. Those by the wayside are the ones who hear; then the devil comes and takes away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved. But the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring no fruit to maturity. But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience.


