He had the opportunity to publicly condemn the atrocities of the war in Ukraine and extol the role of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church in giving spiritual, physical and psychological support to the thousands of refugees now in the diaspora. Bishop Luke also expressed gratitude to all those who opened their hearts – and wallets – to help the Ukrainian refugees. *“A gesture of goodwill is a lamp that shines on everyone,”* he said.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, OCTOBER 30, 2022

20TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 3rd Tone: Sing praises to our God, sing praises! Sing praises to our King, sing praises!

CHOIR: Clap your hands, all ye people! Shout to God with loud songs of joy! Sing praises to our God, sing praises!

READER: Sing praises to our King, sing praises!

CHOIR: He has become my salvation.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Galacians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...But I make known to you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not according to man. For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through the revelation of Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my former conduct in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God beyond measure and tried to destroy it. And I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my contemporaries in my own nation, being more exceedingly zealous for the traditions of my fathers. But when it pleased God, who separated me from my mother's womb and called me through His grace, to reveal His Son in me, that I might preach Him among the Gentiles, I did not immediately confer with flesh and blood, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me; but I went to Arabia, and returned again to Damascus. Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to see Peter and remained with him fifteen days. But I saw none of the other apostles except James, the Lord's brother. **(Galatians 1:11-19)**

CHOIR: Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

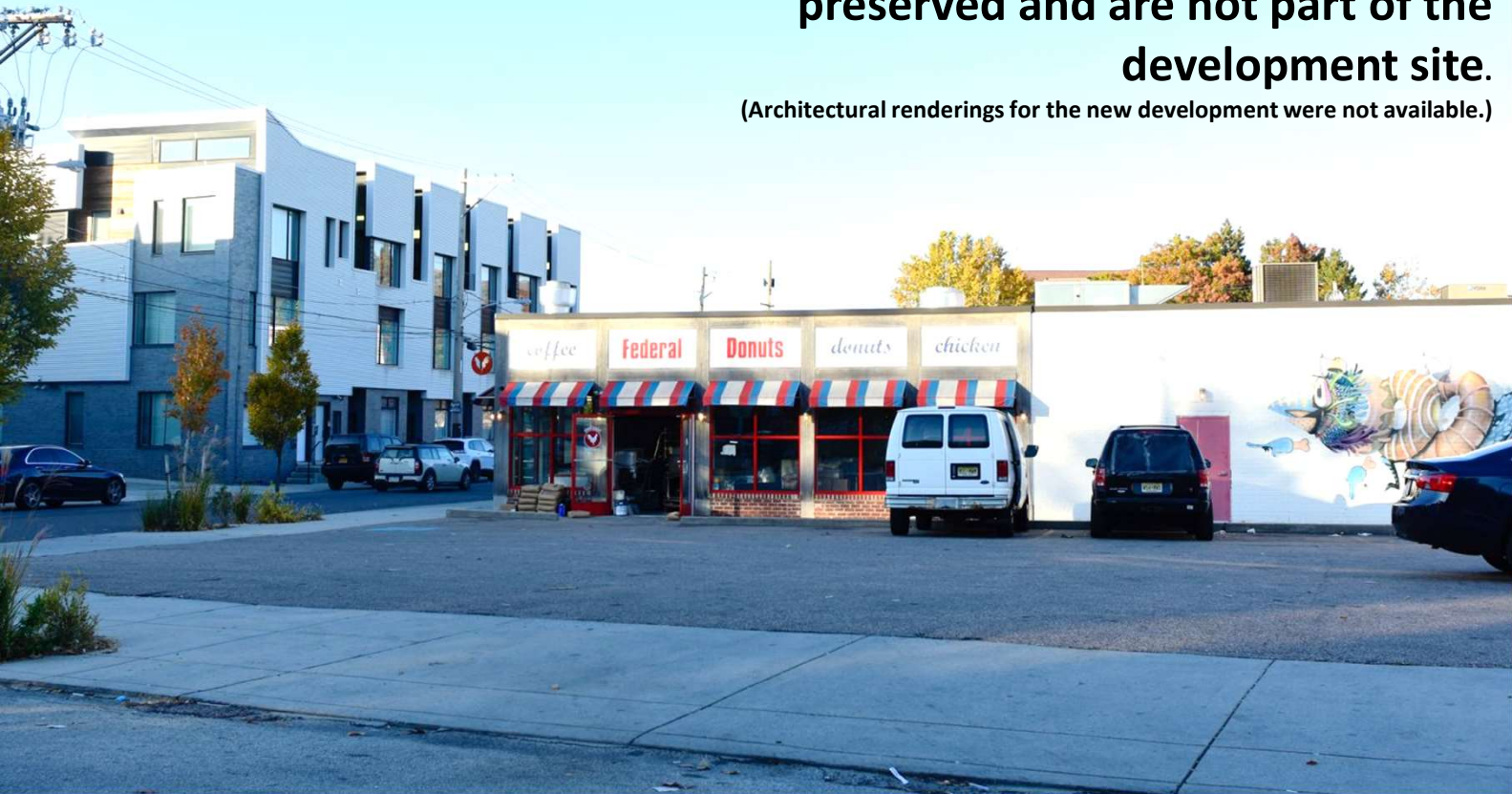
PRIEST: Let us attend. A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some fell by the wayside; and it was trampled down, and the birds of the air devoured it. Some fell on rock; and as soon as it sprang up, it withered away because it lacked moisture. And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up with it and choked it. But others fell on good ground, sprang up, and yielded a crop a hundredfold. When He had said these things He cried, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear! Then His disciples asked Him, saying, "What does this parable mean?" And He said, "To you it has been given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest it is given in parables, that 'Seeing they may not see, And hearing they may not understand.' Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. Those by the wayside are the ones who hear; then the devil comes and takes away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved. But the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring no fruit to maturity. But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience. **(Luke 8:5-15)**

Have you noticed even **MORE** demolition and construction in our neighborhood recently, this time **VERY CLOSE** to St. Nicholas Cathedral? The structures at 711-717 N. 7th Street (that once housed two daycare centers and Liberty Pizza) adjacent to Federal Donuts (corner of 7th & Fairmount) are being demolished to make way for three mixed-use buildings. The new buildings will have a combined total of 21 apartments. Each structure is planned to stand 4 stories tall and feature a mix of residential and commercial space. Federal Donuts and the corner parking lot will be preserved and are not part of the development site.
