News from Father Bohdan in Ukraine

First stop upon arrival in Kyiv on Tuesday, October 19: Pushkinska Street and a private meeting with Patriarch Philaret at his residence. Father Bohdan extended greetings from the congregation of the Patriarch's Stavropigia in Philadelphia, St. Nicholas Orthodox Cathedral, and presented a status report on recent Cathedral activities.





Father Bohdan, Secretary of the Vicariate of the UOC-KP in the USA & Canada, discussed with the Patriarch the Vicariate's accomplishments and expansion efforts in the United States and Canada.



Father Bohdan presented to His Holiness documents confirming the official State of Pennsylvania registrations of the Vicariate and St. Nicholas Orthodox Cathedral. The registrations by the U.S. authorities were based on the decrees of the Patriarch.

October 22, 2021, marked the 26th Anniversary of Enthronement of His Holiness Patriarch Philaret as Primate of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church Kyivan Patriarchate.


MANY MORE YEARS!



Project: Painting the Building's Exterior Walls



As you know, the renovation of the front of our building was finished in March 2020 - and it

was a great success.

Now it is time to focus on the remaining walls of the building -- the north, south and east walls -- not just for aesthetics, but to WATERPROOF the interior.

This is the final step in our waterproofing efforts. The front wall is completed. The roof with snowquards is completed. Caulking all of the windows is completed.


Look at these photos of the many spider cracks in the stucco; the damage done to the north and south stairwells; and our deteriorating Sanctuary wall icons -- all caused by water seepage from the porous exterior walls.

We have received contractor estimates to: power wash the 3 exterior walls, patch the stucco, and seal the cracks with two coats of elastomeric paint.

We are asking for DONATIONS to fund this project. The goal is \$20,000. THANK YOU for helping to preserve our beautiful St. Nicholas Orthodox Cathedral.







The interior iconography in the Sanctuary is flaking. The interior walls of our stairwells are crumbling. We need to correct this problem immediately. Painting the exterior walls with special elastomeric paint will stop the water seepage. This is the last step in our efforts to WATERPROOF our beautiful Cathedral building.

THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, OCTOBER 31, 2021

19TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The Prokeimenon in the 2nd Tone: The Lord is my strength and my song. He has become my salvation.

CHOIR: The Lord is my strength and my song. He has become my salvation.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The reading is from the Corinthians.

PRIEST: Let us attend!

READER: Brothers...The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying. In Damascus the governor, under Aretas the king, was guarding the city of the Damascenes with a garrison, desiring to arrest me; but I was let down in a basket through a window in the wall, and escaped from his hands. It is doubtless not profitable for me to boast. I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord: I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago-whether in the body I do not know, or whether out of the body I do not know, God knows-such a one was caught up to the third heaven. And I know such a man-whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows- how he was caught up into Paradise and heard inexpressible words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter. Of such a one I will boast; yet of myself I will not boast, except in my infirmities. For though I might desire to boast, I will not be a fool; for I will speak the truth. But I refrain, lest anyone should think of me above what he sees me to be or hears from me. And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure. Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. (2 Corinthians 11:31-12:9)

Some fell on rock; and as soon as it sprang up, it withered away because it lacked moisture. And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up with it and choked it. But others fell on good ground, sprang up, and yielded a crop a hundredfold. When He had said these things He cried, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" Then His disciples asked Him, saying, "What does this parable mean?" And He said, "To you it has been given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest it is given in parables, that 'Seeing they may not see, And hearing they may not understand.' Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. Those by the wayside are the ones who hear; then the devil comes and takes away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved. But the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring no fruit to maturity. But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience. (Luke 8:5-15)


