


IN THE BEGINNING GOOD Created THE HEAVENS THE EARTH Genesis 1:1



MESSAGE FROM CATHEDRAL COUNCIL PRESIDENT: TOM HANNEY

Greetings! I hope everyone had an enjoyable summer. There's never summer vacation at St. Nicholas Cathedral. It's business as usual, all year round. We are even busier in the summer as that is when the Festival Director, Judy Hanney, and her team, start preparing for our biggest annual fundraiser of the year: the PIEROGI FESTIVAL, this year on Saturday, November 4, and Sunday, November 5.

Published next to this message is the food prep schedule for the Festival. We expect to have dozens of parishioners at every session.

Most of the year we come and go as individuals, with very busy everyday schedules. But at this time of the year, we ask you to perform a Labor of Love for God and your Church. This is about working as a team and having the dedication of a team to succeed. Do this now! Mark it a Priority! Make Saint Nicholas a Priority! Choose as many dates as possible and dedicate yourself to being there for your team.

Showing up when there is work to be done says you are truly a member of Saint Nicholas. Not showing up says you are just a visitor.

The money raised from the Festival will pay the utility bills for the Cathedral and the Rectory. The true cost of operating the Cathedral is approximately \$16,000 per month. If you are unable to put anything in the collection basket, this is the time to contribute to the Cathedral with your labor – and chop onions, steam cabbage, pinch pierogi. And work at the Festival. If you attended Divine Liturgy and find serenity and a heightened spirituality, this is the time to give thanks and work as a team to achieve our financial goal.

14TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: Brothers...Now He who establishes us with you in Christ and has anointed us is God, who also has sealed us and given us the Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee. Moreover I call God as witness against my soul, that to spare you I came no more to Corinth. Not that we have dominion over your faith, but are fellow workers for your joy; for by faith you stand. But I determined this within myself, that I would not come again to you in sorrow. For if I make you sorrowful, then who is he who makes me glad but the one who is made sorrowful by me? And I wrote this very thing to you, lest, when I came, I should have sorrow over those from whom I ought to have joy, having confidence in you all that my joy is the joy of you all. For out of much affliction and anguish of heart I wrote to you, with many tears, not that you should be grieved, but that you might know the love which I have so abundantly for you.

'But they made light of it and went their ways, one to his own farm, another to his business. And the rest seized his servants, treated them spitefully, and killed them. But when the king heard about it, he was furious. And he sent out his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy. 'Therefore go into the highways, and as many as you find, invite to the wedding.' So those servants went out into the highways and gathered together all whom they found, both bad and good. And the wedding hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who did not have on a wedding garment. So he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' 

Founded in 1931; from then to the present, sewed and purchased robes for the Bishop, priests and altar boys; prepared and served countless fellowship lunches and dinners; contributed much to the beautification of St. Nicholas Church; in 1939 purchased for \$600 the large gold-plated cross that stands before the analoi table; purchased the Winding Sheet (plaschanitsa) used on Holy Friday; in 1945 purchased the magnificent chandelier that hangs in the center of the Sanctuary; continuously contributed to every restoration, beautification and improvement project undertaken by St. Nicholas Church; contributed to the coffers of the Sisterhood treasury; purchased embroidered banners; purchased items for the kitchen, from spoons to the first commercial mixer; members decorate the church for Feast Days, changing the cloths on the furnishings and votive holders; clean the chandelier regularly; crawl on hands and knees to remove wax off the rugs; clean and polish the floor regularly; organize various charitable endeavors, including a School Supply Drive in 2019 for children in Ukraine; purchase the Sanctuary wine for Holy Communion; light Sunday vigil candles and pray for the health of members on their birthdays; hold an annual fundraising luncheon in October commemorating the Feast Day for which it is named; maintain the brass candle stands; carry on the good works and traditions today as the women who served Christ and His Church did from the very first days of His ministry.

A member of the Endowment Fund Committee must be an Orthodox Christian and a member in good standing of St. Nicholas Orthodox Cathedral for at least two years.



Sunday's Scripture Reading

Sunday's Scripture reading is the wedding parable - and Jesus tells this story to teach us about faith. Forgiveness of sins, salvation, eternal life...it has always been, since the very beginning, an invitation to become part of God's church, to become a people of faith. An invitation to the most royal wedding ever. There is one part of this parable which we need to focus on. That one man, that arrogant and disrespectful person who is at the banquet without the wedding coat - and was thrown out. The wedding coat represents salvation. It is the garment which covers our sins and makes us acceptable to God. The problem is that we often want to take that coat off - figuratively and literally. Do not be like the self-important man who was thrown out of the wedding. But thank God we will not be. Not only have we been invited to this great wedding banquet. But we also wear the coats of salvation and

righteousness. And we can rejoice just like happy guests at a wedding!
